

**REGULAR MARCH TERM of THE COMMISSIONERS'  
COURT OF TITUS COUNTY, TEXAS.**

BE IT REMEMBERED, That on the 14th day of March A.D. 1921, there was begun and holden and regular term of the Commissioners' Court of Titus County, Texas, with the following members present, to-wit:-- County Judge, Dan M. Cook, Commissioners W.M. King, L.N. Old, W.M. Edwards and W.A. Fleming and County Clerk Ulman Brown, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:--

Court was opened by a proclamation of the Sheriff of Titus County, Texas,

**BE THE MATTER OF ALLOWING  
ACCOUNTS.**

Motion by Commissioner King, seconded by Commissioner Old, that the accounts entered in the Minutes of Accounts Allowed be allowed. Vol. 2, page 75. The County Judge put the motion with the request that as many as favored the same to vote "AYE"; and those opposed to vote "NO"; Commissioners King, Old, Fleming and Edwards voted "AYE"; The County Judge declared the motion carried and the County Clerk is hereby authorized to draw warrants for same.

**IN THE MATTER OF  
DISPOSING OF ROAD TRACTOR.**

Motion by Commissioner Old and seconded by Commissioner Fleming that the County Judge make investigation as to the best method of disposing of the Avery Road Tractor heretofore bought by Titus County for use on the public roads of Titus County, Texas, and report result of his investigation to the Commissioners Court. The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of said Court with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "AYE"; and those opposed to vote "NO"; All members voted "AYE"; and the County declared the motion carried and the order passed.

**IN THE MATTER OF APPROVING  
THE TAX COLLECTOR'S REPORT.**

Motion by King and Seconded by Old, that the reports of Herbert L. Smith, Tax Collector of Titus County, Texas, Reports being that of February and March 1921, be in all things approved. The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of the court with the request that as many as favored same to vote "AYE"; and those opposed to vote "NO"; All members voted "AYE"; the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

**IN THE MATTER OF APPROVING  
SAM T. SMITH'S BOND as Public**

Weigher, Precinct No. 8 of Titus County Texas.

Motion by Commissioner Fleming and Seconded by Commissioner Edwards that Sam T. Smith's Bond as Public Weigher of Precinct No. 8 of Titus County, Texas, be approved. The County Judge put the motion before the members of the Commissioners' Court with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "AYE"; and those opposed to vote "NO"; all members voting "AYE"; the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

IN THE MATTER OF GRANTING PUBLIC ROAD  
KNOW AS CENTER POINT ROAD.

Motion by Old and seconded by Commissioner Edward to approve the report of E.B. Garrett Earnest Traylor and Ab Hood, Jury of View, of date March 14th. 1921, and the road therein described be opened up and constructed by the Road Overseer. The County Judge put the motion before the members of the Court, with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "AYE"; and those opposed to vote "NO"; King, Edwards, Old and Fleming voted "AYE"; the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

REPORT OF JURY OF VIEW.

We, E.B. Garrett Earnest Traylor and Ab Hood as a Jury of View to lay out a public road as herein described, hear objections of property owners, assess damages, etc., beg to report to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that we took the oath of office required by law in such cases and gave notice in writing to each and every property owner owning lands touched or crossed by said road, to meet us at Center Point School House on the 14th day of March 1921 and make any and all objections and file claims for damages to and with us concerning the laying out of said roads; that on said day we met at the place fixed by said notice to hear any objections and received claims for damages as aforesaid and that none of such persons or any other persons appeared or filed any claims for damages with us concerning said road; that we viewed said road as required by law and we found and so report to your Honorable Body that there will be no damages resulting from laying out or building said roads and that no persons filed any claims with us for said damages to any of said property as follows, to-wit:--

Beginning at the S.E. Corner of the J.F. White farm -- Thence W. to W.W. Thompson's N.W. Corner Thence N. to the S.E. Corner of R.P. White's farm - Thence W. to the N.W. Corner of Dr. S.R. Crabtree's farm -- Thence N. about 300 yds intersecting the Mt. Pleasant and Center Point road two miles east of Mt. Pleasant, Texas, the above described road being a distance of about 3-1/2 miles.

Said lands the best ground upon which to locate said road and will be the location which will require cost less to build and maintain a road.

We, therefore, make this our report and pray that it be approved and that if under the law, it is necessary that we be discharged.

IN THE MATTER OF GRANTING PUBLIC ROAD  
WHICH IS CALLED LANGS CHAPEL ROAD.

MOTION by Commissioner Old, and Seconded by Commissioner Edward, that the report of D.C.Harkrider, J.C.Snodgrass and T.J.Barber, Jury of View, of date March 14th, 1921 be approved, and the road therein described be opened up and constructed by the Road Overseer. The County Judge put the motion to the members of the Commissioners' Court, with the request that as many as favored same to vote "AYE"; and those opposed to vote "NO"; King, Edwards Old and Fleming voted "AYE"; the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

REPORT OF THE JURY OF VIEW.

We, D.C.Harkrider, T.J.Barber and J.C.Snodgrass as a Jury of View to lay out the Public Road herein described, hear objection of property owners, assess damages etc. beg to report to the Commissioners Court of Titus county, Texas, that we took the oath of office required by law in such cases and gave notice in writting to each and every property owned owning land touched or crossed by said road to meet us at Babe Johnson's residence on the - - - day of February, A.D. 1921, and make any and all objections and file claims for damages to and with us concerning the laying out of said road.

That on said day we met at the place fixed by said notice to hear objections and receive claims for damages as aforesaid and that none of such persons or any other person appeared or filed any claim for damages with us concerning said road That we viewed said road as required by law and we found and so report to your honorable body that there will be no damages resulting from laying out or building said road and that no person filed any claim with us for damages to any of said property as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at Fies Williams, and running East One mile to Dave Smith's farm, and then on to Lang's Chapel thence south to E.NoNeal Farm; thence South east to Babe Johnson, -- Thence South East to the Cassen and Pittsburg Public Road.

Said line is the best ground upon which to locate said road and will be a location which will cost less to build and maintain a road.

We, therefore, make this our report and pray that it be approved and if under the law, it is necessary that we be discharged.
