## TITUS COUNTY TEXAS

BE IT REMEMBERED THAT that there was begun and holden a regular term of the of the Honorable Commissioners Court same being the April Term, of 1921, on the 11th day of April, A.D., 1921, with the following officers presents to-wit; Hon. Dan M. Cook, County Judge, and W.M. King, W.A. Flewings, L.H. Old and W.M. Edwards, Commissioners, and Ulman Brown, County Clerk, when the following proceedings were had to wit;

The Sheriff open said Court by proclamation.

In the Matter Approving  
Minutes of Feb, Mar and  
March, Special Term.

After reading of the Minutes of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, at its February and March regular and March Special Terms, by the County Clerk, a motion was made by Commissioner Old and seconded by King that the minutes be approved the County Judge put the motion before the members of said commissioners Court with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those oppose to vote "No" all of said commissioner voted "Aye" being no votes cast for "No" The County Judge ~~pronounced~~ declared the motion carried and the motion carried and the order passed.

In the Matter changing \*  
Voting Box, No. 5. \*  
Maple Springs. \* April, 11th, A.D., 1921.  
Voting Box. 9. (Line) \*

Whereas citizens of precinct No. 5 have appeared before the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, showing cause why the line between voting box No. 5 and Voting box No. 9 should be changed for the better accomodation of the majority of the citizens of voting precinct -No. 5. and Commissioner King made motion and seconded by commissioner Old that the line between voting box No 5 and voting Box No. 9 be changed.

It is therefore ordered adjudged and decreed by the Court that the line between the two voting boxes be changed from it's present site to a line running due North and South from White Oak Creek to Sulphur Creek, intersecting the graded Road at branch 250 yards S.E. of Bud Graf's present residence, . It is further ordered that place of voting in precinct shall hereafter be at Harris Chapel instead of Maple Springs, in voting box No. 5.

In the Matter of allowing \*

Motion by Commissioner Old and seconded by Commissioner King that the accounts be allowed as entered in Vol 2 and page 78 and 79 as entered in Minutes of accounts allowed, the County Judge put the motion beforse the members for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No" all of said members voted "Aye", being no votes cast for "No" the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the Matter of Plumbing \*

Motion by Commissioner Old and seconded by Commissioner King, to allow Geo F. Jackson, the sum of \$18.00, from April 15th to May 15th, 1921, and \$8.00, per month, thereafter and the County Clerk to draw warrant on the Court House and Jail Fund on 15th day of every month, to said Jackson for the upkeep of the plumbing at the County Jail and and Court House and that the County is to furnish all material for said plumbing, The County Judge put the motion for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No" Commissioner King, Edwards, Fleming and Old all voted "Aye" The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed

Sheriff for Boarding of \* April, 11th, 1921.

Whereas, at the February Term, 1921, of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, there was an order entered whereby allowing the Sheriff of Titus County, Texas, the sum of 75 cents per day for boarding prisoners each, and on this day Commissioner Fleming made a motion and seconded by Commissioner Edwards, that said order be rescinded and that the Sheriff be allowed the sum of 60 cents per day for boarding each prisoner for indefinite time and to be changed at the option of the Commissioners Court and said allowance shall begin on the 1st day of April, A.D., 1921. The County Judge put the motion for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No" Commissioners Fleming, Edwards, Old and King, all voted "Aye" The County Judge declared the motion carried and order passed.
