

In the matter of the Resignation of
Bob Teague, as Constable of Prec. No.
8.

April 12th, 1921.

On this the 12th day of April 1920 came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas the resignation of Bob Teague as Constable of Precinct No. 8 of Titus County, when Commissioner King made a motion that said resignation be in all things accepted, which motion was seconded by Commissioner Old, County Judge put the motion before the members of the Commissioners Court for a vote with the request that as many favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those oppose to vote "No" Commissioners; King, Flemings, Old and Edwards, all voted "Aye" and the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the Matter of appointing
Doss Kennedy Constable Prec.
No. 8. Titus County, Texas.

April, 12th, 1921.

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, the application of Doss Kennedy asking the Court to appoint him constable of Precinct No. 8, of Titus County, Texas, when Commissioner Edwards made a motion which was seconded by Commissioner King that the said Doss Kennedy be appointed Constable of said Precinct No.8 to fill out the unexpired term of Bob Teague. The County Judge put motion before the members of said Court for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to "Aye" and those oppose to vote "No" Commissioner King, Fleming, Edwards and Old all voted "Aye" the county Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the matter of allowing
 5% Discount to County Agent
 Warrants. April 12th, 1921.

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioner Court of Titus County, Texas, the matter of allowing 5% discount to the warrants of County Agent of the Farmers' Cooperative Demonstration, warrants, when Commissioner King made a motion and was seconded by Commissioner Edwards, that 5% discount be added to the warrants of the County Agent of Farmers' Cooperative Demonstration Wark, and 5% Discount be allowed for the warrant issued in March, 1921, and shall be added to all warrants to be issued said agent for a term of 12 months. The County Judge put the motion before the commissioners Court for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those oppose to vote "No", Commissioners King, Fleming, Edwards and Old all voted "Aye" The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the matter of allowing to
 Pauper Rogers, funds to go
 Hot Springs Ark. April 12th, 1921.

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, Funds to send Pauper Rogers to Hot Springs, Ark., when Commissioner made a motion that the County Clerk issue a warrant on the General County Fund, for \$25.00, plus 10% discount \$2.50, total \$27.50, payable to Dan N. Cook, County Judge, to purchase a ticket to Hot Springs, Ark, for said Rogers, and to deliver him the rest of the money, The County Judge Put the motion before the commissioners for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those oppose to vote "No" Commissioners King, Fleming, Edwards and Old all voted "No". the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the Matter of filing
 Suit on Convict Bonds April 12th, 1921.

Motion made by Commissioner Edwards and seconded by commissioner Fleming that the County Attorney file suit for the collection of convict bonds that L.A. Lewellen as principals and ~~xxxxxxx~~ the other subscribers thereto as sureties, The County Judge put the motion before the members of the Court for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those oppose to vote "No" Commissioner King, Old, Fleming and Edwards vote "Aye" The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.
