

## Commissioners Court, June Term, 1921.

BE IT REMEMBERED That there was begun and helden a regular Term of the Honorable Commissioners Court in and for Titus County, Texas, on June 13th, 1921, with the following officers present to-wit: Hon Dan M. Cook, County Judge, W.A. Fleming, L.N. Old, W.M. King and J.V. Edwards, Commissioners and Ulman Brown, County Clerk, when the following proceedings were had, to-wit;

Court was opened by proclamation of the Sheriff of Titus County, Texas.

In the Matter of approving #

Read Commissioner Bend # June 13th, 1921.  
Jno. B. Stephens. #

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, the matter of approving the bend of John B. Stephens, as Read Commissioner of Titus County, Texas, when Commissioner Edwards made a motion to approve said bend of John B. Stephens, as a member of the Permanent Read Commissioner of Titus County, Texas, seconded by Commissioner L.N. Old, The County Judge put the motion before the Court for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No". Commissioner Edwards, Old, King and Fleming all voted "Aye" The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

Motion by Commissioner King, seconded by Commissioner Edwards that Titus County, build State Highway Number One from Station 377100 west of Mount Pleasant, Texas, to the Franklin County Line as per plans on file and approved by the State Highway Department and maintain same at their own expense, The County Judge put the motion before the members of Court for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No" Commissioner Edwards, King, Fleming and Old all voted "Aye", The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

Motion by Commissioner Old and seconded by Commissioner King, to allow the accounts as the same entered in Minutes of Accounts Allowed Vol. 2, page 86 and 87, The County Judge put the motion before the members of said Court for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No" Commissioner King, Fleming, Edwards and Old, all voted "Aye" The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

Sheriff for Boarding Prisoners. # June 13th, 1921.

Whereas, at the February Term, 1921, of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, there was an order passed and entered whereby allowing the Sheriff of Titus County, Texas, the sum of 80 cents per day for boarding prisoners each, said allowance shall begin February 1st, 1921; that at the April Term, 1921, said order was rescinded and that he be allowed the sum of 60 cents per day for boarding each prisoner, said allowance shall begin on April 1st, 1921, and on this day Commissioner Edwards, made a motion seconded by Commissioner King, that the Sheriff of Titus County, Texas, refund all sums of money that he has received from the County for Boarding Prisoners, in excess of 60 cents per day, and from this day for indefinite time and to be changed at the option of the

Commissioners Court; he shall receive the sum of 75 cents per day for each prisoner boarding at the Jail, The County Judge put the motion before the members for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those oppose to vote "No" Commissioner King, Edwards, Old and Fleming all voted "Aye", The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, the matter of allowing Homer Hamilton, Tax Assessor, of Titus County, Texas, the sum \$200.00, advance for assessing Taxes for the year of 1921, Commissioner Fleming made a motion to advance the sum of \$200.00, said motion seconded by Commissioner Old, The County Judge put the motion before the members of said Court for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those oppose to vote "No" Commissioner King, Fleming, Old and Edwards, all voted "Aye" The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

Dickson, County Treasurer, from April 1st, to June 8th, 1921, be approved, The County Judge put the motion before the members of said Court for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those oppose to vote "No", Commissioner Fleming, Old, Edwards and King, all voted "Aye" The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus, County, Texas, expense account of John J. Reeves, Sheriff, from December, 1st. 1920 to June 1st. 1921, as Sheriff, when Commissioner Edwards made a motion and seconded by Commissioner King that said report of Expenses as Sheriff be approved, The County Judge put the motion before the members of said Court for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those oppose to vote "No" Commissioner, King, Edwards, Fleming and Old all voted "Aye" The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the Matter of approving #  
the appointment of Olive #  
Kelley, as Deputy County # June 13th, 1921.  
Clerk. #

This the 13th day of June, A.D. 1921, came on to be heard the application of Ulman Brown, County Clerk, for the approval of the appointment of Olive Kelley, as Deputy County Clerk, in and for Titus County, Texas, and the Court having considered such application, being of the opinion that it should be approved, and being of the opinion that Olive Kelley is a competent Deputy County Clerk, and having duly qualified by oath and otherwise as re-

quired by law, it is accordingly ordered that she be, and she is hereby, appointed Deputy County Clerk, 1<sup>st</sup> and for Titus County, Texas, to do and perform any and all acts and things pertaining to the office of said County Clerk of said County and State, and that for her services she shall receive the sum \$1000.00, per month, from the County Clerk for an indefinite time and to be changed at the option of said County Clerk, The County Judge put the above order for a vote of the members of said Court with the request that as many as favored said order to vote "Aye" and those oppose to vote "No" Commissioner King, Edwards, Fleming and Old all voted "Aye" The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

Motion by King and seconded by Old that County Judge be authorized to make transfers of the County's funds wherever the same is necessary in facilitation payment of Bonds & Interest or other matters requiring immediate attention, The County Judge put the motion before the members for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those oppose to vote "No", Commissioner King, Edwards, Fleming and Old all voted "Aye", The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

On this the 13th day of June 1921, Commissioner Edwards offered following order to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, and made a motion that the same be passed by the court, which motion was seconded by Commissioner Old. It appears to the Commissioner Court of Titus County, Texas that it is necessary to transfer the sum of \$5,059.49, from State Highway to Special Road Fund, and the sum of \$5,000.00, from State Highway to Special Road to take care of Emergency claims, and the sum of \$11,332.86, from State Highway to Special Road,, The County Judge put the motion before the members of said Court for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those oppose to vote "No" Commissioner King, Edwards, Fleming and Old all voted "Aye" The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.
