

BE IT REMEMBERED That there was begun and holden a Special Term of the Honorable Commissioner Court of Titus County, Texas, at the Court House in the City of Mount Pleasant, Texas, on this the 30th day of July, A.D., 1921, with the following officers present to wit; Hon. Dan M. Cook, County Judge, Commissioners W.M. King, W.M. Edwards, L.R. Old and W.A. Flemings and Ulman Brown, County, Clerk when the following proceedings were had to wit;

In the matter of Settlement #

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, the matter of Settlement of Interest on County Funds with State National Bank, of Mount Pleasant, when W.M. King, made a motion and seconded by Commissioner Fleming that the State National Bank, of Mount Pleasant, be allowed to pay \$1000.00, in compromise of claim of Titus County against said Bank for interest on daily balances during that time said bank was Depositary, the County Judge put the motion before the members of said Court for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No" Commissioners King, Old, Fleming and Edwards all voted "Aye" The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the matter of approving #
Special Election returns # July 30th, A.D., 1921.

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, the matter of approving the returns of the Special Election held on July 23rd, 1921, Whereas said election was on 3 amendments to the Constitution of this State, when Commissioner Old made a motion and seconded by Commissioner King, to approve the returns of said Election as the same is entered in Vol. 1, page 78 record of Election Returns, of Titus County, Texas, The County Judge put the motion before the members of said Court with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No" Commissioners King, Old, Edwards and Fleming all voted "Aye" the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed, and ordered the clerk of this Court issue warrants for \$4.00, each for Judges of said Election and the sum of \$2.00, each for the Clerks of said Election.

In the matter of of the
 Resignation of T.T.Polk,
 and D.H.Snedgrass, as Superintendent
 of Cattle Dipping.

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, the Resignation of T.T.Polk and D.H.Snedgrass, as Superintendants of Cattle dipping, when Commissioner King made a motion and seconded by Commissioner Old, to receive said resignations and to recommend to the Live Stock San. Commission the following named persons to act as superintend the cattle dipping in Commissioner Precinct No. 3 and 4, which I.F.Fishback in Commissioner Pre. 3, to succeed T.T.Polk, and in Commissioner Pre. 4, Ernest Traylor, to succeed D.H.Snedgrass, and to allow said employees the sum of \$110.00 per month, out of the General County Fund as being Superintendant of Cattle dipping, the County Judge put the motion before the members of said Court for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those oppose to vote "N". Commissioner King, Old, Edwards and Fleming all vote "Aye" The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the matter of withdrawing
 commissions as overseers on
 Highways.

July 30th, 1921.

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, the matter of withdrawing Commissions of Overseers on Highways in Titus County, Texas, when Commissioner Edwards, made motion that Commissioners of all Overseers on Highways be withdrawn and the Clerk be authorize to notify them as such, and the Overseers on Side-roads adjacent and leading from Highways authorized to warn hands living on Highways or living nearest the Highway to work the sideroads nearest them and in case such roads do not need work then at the discretion of the Commissioner of the Precinct in which said road is located said hands may be worked upon such public Roads nearest their place of residence that needs work, and the Clerk ordered to send copy of this order to all overseers and published once in each paper of the County, The County Judge put the motion before the members of said court for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those oppose to vote "No", Commissioner King, Edwards, Old and Fleming all voted "Aye" and the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

The above and foregoing minutes of the Commissioners Court read and approved this the 30th, day of July, A.D., 1921.
