

January Special Term of the Commissioners Court Titus County, Texas.

January 14th, 1922.

Be it remembered that there was begun and holden a Special Term of the Commissioners Court in and for Titus County, Texas, on the 14th day of January, 1922, the following officers were present to-wit: Hon Dan N. Cook County Judge, Commissioners L.H.Olds, W.A.Flemings, W.M.King and W.M.Edwards and Ulman Brown, Clerk of said Court when the following proceedings were had to-wit, and after the court was open up by proclamation of John J. Reeves, Sheriff of Titus County, Texas.

IN THE MATTER OF APPOINTING
SUPERINTENDANT FOR HIGHWAYS.

On this day came on to be heard the applications of various persons for the appointment of a Highway Superintendent, and after considering all of said application, Commissioner W.M.King, mad a motion and second by Commissioner L.H.Old, to appoint E.H.Horton, as Superintendent of Highways in Titus County, Texas, at a salary of \$100. per month, to paid on the first day of each month, out of the Highways Auto Fund, and said Horton shall have the power to employ such labor as necessary for the maintenance of the Highways with the approval of this Court and said employees shall be paid on the first day of each month, of the Highway Auto fund, The County Judge put the motion before the members of said Court with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those oppose to vote "No", Commissioner Fleming, Old and King, voted "Aye" and Commissioner Edwards, voted "No" the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.
