

## REGULAR TERM OF THE COMMISSIONERS COURT, TITUS COUNTY, TEXAS.

MARCH, TERM, 1922.

BE IT REMEMBERED That there was begun and holden a regular term of of Commissioners Court in and for Titus County, Texas, on the 13th day of March, 1922, with the following officers present, to-wit: Hon. Dan M. Cook, County Judge, Commissioners W.N. King, W.A. Fleming, V.M. Edwards and L.H. Old, Clerk of said Court, Ulman Brown, when the following proceedings were had to wit:

Court open up by proclamation of Jno. J. Reeves, Sheriff, Titus County, Texas.

IN THE MATTER OF A DEMONSTRATION  
AGENT DURING THE YEAR 1922.

Motion by Commissioner Edwards and second by Commissioner King that last years contract with A.M. College in connection with the farm demonstration agent be renewed. The County Judge put the motion before the members of said court with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those oppose to vote "No" Commissioners Fleming, King, Old and Edwards all voted "Aye" the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the Matter of Transferring  
Funds.

Motion by Commissioner Edwards, and second by Commissioner Old to transfer all interest on daily balances at the Depository to the General County Fund, except that the interest on the Special Roads account shall be paid to the credit of that account; The County Judge put the motion before the members of said Court with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those oppose to vote "No", Commissioners Fleming, Old, King and Edwards, vote "Aye" the county Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the Matter of Condemning  
Army Trucks.

Motion by Commissioner Edwards and second by Commissioner Old that the three Army trucks now in the possession of the County be inspected with the view of condemning the same, and if they are condemned, then the County Judge is by this order directed to sell the same to the person or persons offering the best cash price, and if they are sold for sufficient amount to purchase another from the Government, then the County Judge is directed to take the matter of purchasing another truck up with the State Highway Department, and report fully at the next term of this court. The County Judge put the motion before the members of said court with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those to vote "No" Commissioner King, Old, Fleming and Edwards all voted "Aye" The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order carried.

In the Matter of Changing Certain  
Offices of County Officials.

Motion by Commissioner Edwards and Second by Commissioner King, that the following changes be made in the office rooms of the officers hereafter mentioned, said change to be made not later than the 1st. day of April, 1922, the Tax Collector, Herbert L. Smith, and the Tax Assessor, Homer Hamilton, shall occupy the office now occupied by the County

Attorney, and Justice of the Peace and Constable; the County Attorney shall occupy the office now occupied by the Tax Collector, Herbert L. Smith, the Justice of the Peace and constable shall occupy the office now occupied by the County Treasurer, S.B. Dickson, the Treasurer shall occupy the office with the District Clerk. It is further directed that Frank Sims vacate the office now occupied by him not later than the 1st day of April, 1922. The County Judge put the motion before the members of said court with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those oppose to vote "No" Commissioners King, Edwards, Old and Fleming all vote "Aye" the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the Matter of approving Tax Collector and County Treasurer.

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, the matter of approving Tax Collector Herbert L. Smith, January Report, and County Treasurer Quarterly Report, when Commissioner Old made a motion and second by Commissioner King, to approve same, the County Judge put the motion before the members of said Court with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those oppose to vote "No" Commissioner King, Old, Fleming and Edwards all voted "Aye" the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the Matter of Transferring Road Hands.

Motion by Commissioner Old and second by Commissioner King, that all hands on Luther Taylors place be transferred from Road No. 88 to Road No. 123, The County Judge put the motion before the members of said Court with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those oppose to vote "No" Commissioners King, Old, Edwards and Fleming all voted "Aye" The County Judge declared the motion carried, and the order passed.

In the Matter of Allowing Pauper funds Mrs Darling, Funds.

Motion by Commissioner Edwards and second by Commissioner King to Mrs. Darling the sum of \$10.00, to be allowed out of the General County Fund, to be issued on the 1st of each month, for the support of her son, the County Judge put the motion before the members of said Court for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those oppose to vote "No" All of said Commissioners voted "Aye" the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the Matter of Employing Tick Inspectors.

Motion by Commissioner King and second by Commissioner Old, that Garland Godsey and Fred Fishback be hired at \$120.00 per month as tick inspectors, and their pay to start March 15th, 1922, and to be issued on the General County Fund, The County Judge put the motion before the members of said court for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "aye" and those oppose to vote "No" Commissioner King, Old, Fleming and Edwards all voted "Aye" the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the Matter of Approving Account.

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, the matter approving accounts, when Commissioner King Made a motion to allow said account and order the clerk of said Court to issue warrants for same, The County Judge put the motion before the members of said court for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those oppose to vote "No" Commissioners King, Old, Fleming and Edwards all voted "aye" the county Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the matter appointing  
Election Judges for 1922.
