BE IT REMEMBERED THAT there was begun and holden a regular term of the Commission Court, in and for Titus County, Texas, with the following officers present, to-wit: Hon Dan M. Cook, County Judge, Commissioners W.M. Edwards, W.M. King, W.A. Fleming and L.H. Old. and County Clerk Ulman Brown, when the following proceeding were had, to wit:

In the Matter of Purchasing  
School Bonds, No 5. District

There came on to be considered by the court that matter of purchasing \$500.00 worth of school house bonds from Common School District No 5 of Titus County, Texas. It appears that said bonds are dated April 10th. 1922 and bear interest from date at the rate of 5% per annum and that there is accumulated on said bonds the sum of

\$14.05 in interest and that said bonds in principal and interest are worth \$514.05, at this date. County Commissioner Olds made a motion that the permanent school fund of Titus County, Texas, purchase said bonds and pay the sum of \$514.05 for them, which motion was seconded by County Commissioner Fleming, Motion put and was voted for by County Commissioners Olds, Edwards, King and Fleming. It is therefore ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners court of Titus County, Texas, that said bonds be purchased and that clerk of this court issue his order upon the treasurer of the said funds for the sum of \$514.05 in payment therefor.

In the Matter of allowing Accounts

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioner Court of Titus County, Texas, the Matter of allowing accounts, When Commissioner Edwards made a motion to allow said accounts as same entered in Vol 2, pages 151- 155. motion second by Commissioner King., The County Judge put the motion before the members of said court for a vote with the request that as many as favor said motion to vote "Aye" and those oppose to vote "No" all Commissioners voting "Aye", The County Judge Judge declared motion carried and the order passed.

In the Matter of canvassing  
the return of the General Election.

On this day came on to be considered by the commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, the Matter of canvassing the returns of the General Election held throughout Titus County on Nov. 7th. 1922, and finds that each candidate received the respective number of votes set opposite their names which is of record in the Record of Election Returns of Titus County, Texas, It is ordered and adjudged by the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas that the candidates receiving the highest number of votes be declared elected to their respective offices for a term of two years.

In the Matter of approving Tax  
Collector Reports, for Oct.

On this day came on to be considered by the commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, the matter of approving the Tax Collectors Reports of H.L.S mith, when Commissioner Edwards made a motion and second by commissioner King that same be approved. The County Judge put the motion before the members of said court for a vote with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No" Commissioners King, Old, Edwards and Fleming, all voted "Aye", the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the Matter of approving  
Quarterly Reports.

On this day came on to be considered by the commissioners court of Titus County, Texas, the matter of approving Officers Quarterly Reports, as follows, to wit; Ulman Brown, County Clerk, W.E.McClintock, District Clerk, John J. Reeves, Sheriff, Sam Porter, Justice of the Peace Prs. No. One, R.A.Lawler, Justice of the Peace Beace Pre No 5, W.M.King, Justice of the Peace, Pre. No 3, H.B.Green, Justice of the Peace Pre. No 8 Titus County, Texas. T.B.Brown Justice of the Peace Pre No. 4, . Commissioner King, made a motion to approve said reports second by Commissioner Edwards, The County Judge put the motion before the members of said court for a vote with the request that as many as favor said motion to vote "Aye" and those oppose to vote "No" Commissioners King, Fleming, Edwards, and Old all voted "Aye" the county Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

In the Matter of allowing

On this the 14th day of November, 1922. when came H.L.Smith, Tax Collector, to Titus County, with the following statement, to the court, The Difference between the W.B.Oliver Rendition for 1921 was \$400.00 - \$10.00 equal \$390.00 the County's part of it is \$9.75. and Int.
