Edwards, County Commissioner Precinct No. 1; W.M. King, County Commissioner in Pre. No. 3; W.E. King, Justice of the Peace Pre. No. 3; R.E. Hucksba, Commissioner, Precinct Nos. 4, 5 and 7; W.A. Fleming, Commissioner, Pre. Nos. 2, 6 and 8; Herbert Smith, Tax Collector, County Bond and State Bond; D.H. Snedgrass, Constable Pre. No. 5; R.A. Lawler, Justice of the Peace No. 5; C.W. Williams, Constable, Pre. No. 6; Sam T. Smith, Public Weigher, Pre. No. 8; W.C. Neucant, Public Weigher of Pre. No. 3; C.Y. Persons, County Surveyor; J.A. Lee Justice of the Peace, Pre. No. 6; Sam Porter, Justice of the Peace, Precinct No. 1; J.S. Horn, Constable, Pre. No. 7; which motion was seconded by Commissioner W.M. King.
