

BE IT REMEMBERED, that a Regular Term of the Commissioners' Court in and for Titus County, Texas, was begun and holden on the 10th day of September A.D. 1923 with the following members present to-wit: Dan M. Cook, County Judge; Commissioners W.M. King W.H. Edwards, W.A. Fleming and R.E. Huckeba, Ulman Brown County Clerk and W.L. Zalley, Sheriff Court was opened by a proclamation of the Sheriff of Titus County, Texas, and the following proceedings were had to-wit:

IN THE MATTER OF PURCHASING SCHOOL BONDS OF COMMON SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 26.

It appears to Commissioners Court, Titus County, Texas, that Common School District No. 26, Titus County, Texas, has offered its school house bonds No. 24 to 28 inclusive, bearing 5% interest, dated October 10th 1918, aggregating \$500. principal and \$12.50 interest to Permanent School Fund of Titus County, Texas, as an investment.

It is ordered by Commissioners Court Titus County, Texas, that said bonds be purchased as an investment for Permanent School Fund of Titus County, Texas, at par and interest.

IN THE MATTER OF APPROVING ACCOUNTS

Motion by Commissioner King and Second by Edwards that the accounts be allowed, as same appear itemized in Vol. 3 page..... Minutes of Accounts allowed. The County Judge put the motion before the Commissioners' Court with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "AYE" and those opposed to vote "NO". All voted "AYE". The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

IN THE MATTER OF DELINQUENT TAXES OF TITUS COUNTY.

On this day came on to be considered the matter of the delinquent taxes of Titus County, Texas since the 1st day of December A.D. 1908, as shown by the Delinquent Rolls of Titus County, Texas, Motion by Edwards and Second by King that the County Attorney proceed to file suit and collect said taxes and that the County Attorney be not required to publish same. The County Judge put the motion before the Commissioners' Court with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "AYE" and those opposed to vote "NO". All voted "AYE" The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

IN THE MATTER OF ALLOWING ACCOUNTS.

Motion by Commissioner Edwards, Second by Commissioner King that the Clerk issue Warrants, one for \$650.00 and the other for \$700.00, being Attorney's fees, expense and legal services of H.C.Surt & Co., on bonds against the General County Fund of Titus County, Texas. The County Judge put the motion before the Commissioner's Court of Titus County, Texas, with the request that as many as favored the motion would vote "AYE" and those opposed to vote "NO". All voted "AYE". The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

IN THE MATTER OF AN ACCOUNT
HELD BY GLIDDEN & COMPANY.

Motion by Commissioner King and Second by Commissioner Fleming that the County Treasurer cancel a warrant issued June 11th 1923 for \$715.00 to Glidden Company, and that warrant for \$390.00 issued in April 1922 and one for \$325.00 issued in June 1922, draw interest at the rate of 6% from date. The County Judge put the motion before the Commissioners' Court with the request that as many as favored the motion would vote "AYE" and those opposed to vote "NO". All voted "AYE". The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

IN THE MATTER OF REMOVING A SCHOOL HOUSE
IN SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 6.

Motion by Commissioner Edwards and second by Commissioner Fleming that the court grant authority to the Trustees of School District No. 6, to tear down, remove, sell or otherwise dispose of said building, which said building was formerly erected for a school building, but has been abandoned for such purpose. The County Judge put the motion before the Commissioners' Court of Titus County, Texas, with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "AYE" and those opposed to vote "NO". All voted "AYE". The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.
