On this the 11th day of February AD 1925, Commissioners Cameron Made a motion Second by King to allow Luther Taylor Tax Collector \$100.00 for correcting the Rolls for said County. The County Judge put the motion before the court with the request that all favored said Motion to vote Aye all opposed to vote NO.
COMMISSIONERS KING Luna and Cameron all vote Yes and commissioners Lindsey voted NO. The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

IN THE MATTER OF ALLOWING REFUND TO MCCLINTOCK AND SMITH

On this the 18th day of February AD 1925, Commissioner Cameron made a motion second by Luna to allow H.L.Smith, \$736.45 for commission that he failed to collect when making out his reports and to allow W.E.McClintock \$18.79 for round on fees for the year 1922 money that he turned in to the County that should have been retained by him. The County Judge put the motion before the court with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote AYE all opposed to vote NO Commissioners Luna King Lindsey and Cameron all vote "AYE" The County Judge declared the motion carried and order passed.

IN THE MATTER OF APPROVING R. ALANLERS QUARTERLY REPORT

On this 11th day of Feb AD 1924 Commissioner Cameron made a Motion seconded by King, to approved R.A.Lawlers, Quartely Report, quarter ending Jan 31st 1924, The County Judge put the Motion before the court with the request that all favored said motion to vote AYE and all opposed to Vote NO. Commissioners King Luma Lindsay and Cameron all voted AYE The County Judge Declared the Motion carried and the order passed.

IN THE MATTER OF ALLOWING ACCOUNTS, FEB 11th 1924

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas , the matter of approving accounts and after examining same Commissioner Cameron made a motion seconded by Lindsay that said accounts be allowed as the same appeared in Minutes of accounts Allowed Vol 3 page _____. The County Judge put the motion before the members of said court for a vote with request that as many as favored said motion to vote "AYE" and those opposed to vote "NO". All of said commissioners Voted "AYE" The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

IN THE MATTER OF ALLOWING PAUPERS FUNDS.

ON THIS THE 11th day of February came on to be considered,
by the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas in allowing Paupers funds as heretofore been allowed, and the Clerk of the County Court is hereby ordered to continue issuing Warrants at the 15th of each month, until further orders of this court.

IN THE MATTER OF INVESTING SCHOOL FUNDS.

On this the 11th day of February at its regular February Term came on to be considered by the Commissioner's court the matter of investing school funds and sinking funds in bonds after considering same Commissioner Cameron made a motion seconded by Commissioner Luna that the School house bonds of common School districts Nos 27 and 30 be purchased at par and interest by the permanent school fund of Titus County Texas and paid for according to the ability of the permanent school fund using the amount on hand and the balance as it accumulates until such bonds are absorbed.

The County Judge put the Motion before the Court with the request that all favored said motion to vote AYE and all Opposed to vote NO. Commissioners, Luna King Cameron and Lindsay all voted AYE, the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

IN THE MATTER OF SCHOOL TAX LEVY FOR THE YEAR OF 1925

On this the 11th day of February AD 1925 came on to be considered by the Commissioner's Court in and for the County of Titus State of TEXAS the matter of levying a tax upon the real and personal property of Titus County TEXAS for the year of 1925 for the School District as is now below and Commissioner King made a motion which was seconded by Commissioner Luna that the Tax Levy for each School district be as follows to-wit was ordered and appeared..
