

BE IT REMEMBERED on the 9th day of May A.D. 1927 that there was begun and holden a regular Term of the Commissioner's Court in and for Titus County, Texas on this the 9th day of May A. D. 1927 with the following officers present to wit: Hon M.L. Myers Judge C.P. Lindsey , L.H. Old, A.J. Luns, W.M. King, and W.E. McClintock Clerk when the following proceedings, were had to wit:

IN THE MATTER OF APPOINTING ROAD HANDS:

On this the 9th day of May 1927 at its regular monthly meeting with the following officers being present to wit: M.L. Myers presiding C.P. Lindsey, Commissioner Pre No. 1. A.J. Luns Commissioner Pre No. 2, W.M. King, Commissioner Pre No. 3, L.H. Old Commissioner Pre No. 4. and W.E. McClintock County Clerk, when came on to be considered the matter of employing, road hands, the matter was discussed, Commissioner Old made a motion seconded by Commissioner King that Bowden Menkin and Johnson be employed as regular hands as long as three hands are needed and use, and that if either commissioner needed and extra hands while working in his district, that he be allowed to employ who he desired, The County judge put the motion before the Court with the request that as money as favored the motion to vote AYE and those opposed to Vote No. Commissioner Old, King and Luns Voted in the affirmative Commissioner Lindsey Voted in the negative and the County Judge declared the motion carried the order passed.

IN THE MATTER OF PAUPERS:

On this the 9th day of May 1927 came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, the matter of paying J.H. Herren a monthly sum as pauper and after discussing, the matter and ascertaining the said Herren is now sick and unable to procure the necessary funds for treatment and that within thirty days it can be determined if he can be cured and if not he will cease further treatment, Commissioner Old made a motion seconded by Commissioner King that the said Herren be allowed \$25.00 out of the paupers fund to be paid on the fifteenth of this month but he be not allowed any further sum without a further order of this Court. The County judge put the motion before the Court with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote AYE and those opposed to vote NO. all Commissioners being present voting in the affirmative the County judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

IN THE MATTER OF PAUPERS:

On this the 9th day of May 1927 came on to be considered the matter of allowing Mrs. Fannie Robins a sum of money out of the paupers fund to be paid monthly and after discussing, the matter and ascertaining the fact that she is above seventy years old, blind, helpless and without any way of self support, and without relatives, Commissioner Lindsey made a motion seconded by Commissioner, Luns that she be allowed \$15.00 for the current month to be paid on the 15th day of May, and that thereafter until further orders of this Court that she be paid \$10.00 a month to be paid on the 15th day of the month. The County judge put the motion before the Court with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote AYE and those opposed to vote NO all commissioner's being present and voting in the affirmative the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

IN THE MATTER OF RAISING THE JUDGE EX-OFFICIO SALARY :

On this the 9th day of May 1927 came on to be considered the matter of paying ex-officio salary to the County Judge, and after discussing the matter and ascertaining the fact that the County Judge does not receive any sum for holding commissioners Court as

Formerly, Commissioner Old made a motion seconded by Commissioners Lane that the County Judge Ex-officio salary be raised \$12.50 per month above the sum allowed by the order passed at the Feb Term of Court 1927. The County Judge put the motion before the Court with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote AYK and those opposed to vote NO, all Commissioners being present and voting in the affirmative the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

IN THE MATTER OF APPROVING LUTHER TAYLOR'S REPORT;

On this the 9th day of May 1927 came on to be considered the matter of approving the monthly report, of Luther Taylor Tax Collector of Titus County, Texas, and after examining said report and ascertaining, that it in every respect confirmed, to the requirements, Commissioner Old made, a motion seconded by Commissioner, King that said report be approved and the County Judge put the motion before the Court with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote AYK and those opposed the motion to vote No. all Commissioners being present and voting in the affirmative and voting in the affirmative the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

IN THE MATTER OF APPROVING LUTHER TAYLOR'S ANNUAL SETTLEMENT;

On this the 9th day of May 1927 came on to be considered the matter of approving the annual settlement of Luther Taylor Tax Collector of Titus County Texas, and after examining the same and ascertaining that it in every conformed to the requirements of law relating to the annual settlement, of Tax Collectors, Commissioners, Old made a motion seconded by Commissioner King that the report of annual settlement, be approved, the County Judge put the motion before the Court with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote AYK and those opposed to vote NO all commissioners being and voting in the affirmative the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.
