The County Judge put the motion before the Court with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote "AYN" and those opposed to vote "HO". All being present and voting in the affirmitave the Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

Commissioner Bowden made a motion second by Commissioner Wilson that the County pay Ed Brown \$5.00 per month out of the Pauper fund, he being unable to care for himself. The County Judge put the motion before the Court with the request that as many as INXXXXXXXX favored said motion to vote "AYE" and those opposed to vote "HO".

All being present and votints in the affirmative the Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

Commissioner Bowden made a motion seconed by Commissioner Eilly to invent as much and not to exceed \$700.00 of the permanent school funds in Liberty Hill school bende. The County Judge put the motion before the Court with the request that as many as favored said motion to vote AIE^a and those opposed to vote "NO". All being present and voting in the affirmative the Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.
