\$2,990.09 Titus County Warrants Bank's receipt of same dated Dec 16, 1933 which are now held by the said County Bond State Bank of Mt Pleasant, Texas, in trust for the County of Titus.

Be it further remembered, that a quorum was present at said meeting consisting of Commissioners R.L. Thomas, R.W. Blankenship, L.H. Wilson, and A.S. Lilly, the above and foregoing order was passed in open Court with the above named members present this the 12, day of Feb 1934

Highway No 1.turning East here and following Highway No 1 to the Cotton Belt Railway at
Esham's Hardwood mill turning North here and following a line that would intersect the
Cookville, pro line The territory between these boundaries running East and West bounded by the
Greenhill Pre on the North will compose the voting Box No 15 The citizens voting at Phil
Blackwell's garage.
