

IN THE MATTER OF THE TAX RATE FOR THE YEAR 1935.

Whereas, heretofore to wit: On the 9th day of Sept AD 1935 the Commissioners Court of Titus Co Texas, passed an order as follows; to wit;

The Jury Fund	10c

Road & Bridge.....	15c

On the above Road and Bridge 15c should read as follows to wit:-

Road & Bridge Int & Sinking fund	10 $\frac{1}{2}$ c
Road & Bridge	4 $\frac{1}{2}$ c

The above order having been made the motion of Commissioners Thomas for its passage was duly seconded by Commissioner Stringfellow, therefore the question being called for the County Judge put the motion to vote of the members of the Commissioners Court, and the motion carried by the following vote; Commissioners Stringfellow, Thomas, Wilson and Lunsford, voting AYE and None Voting No."

The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order duly passed and adopted and the County Clerk was instructed to record the same in the Minutes of the Court.

ON THIS the 14th day of October, 1935, the Commissioner's Court of Titus County, Texas, convened in regular session, at the regular meeting place thereof in the Court House at Mount Pleasant, Texas, all members of the Court, to-wit:

E. L. McERROY, COUNTY JUDGE, presiding; and,
T. J. STRINGFELLOW, COMMISSIONER, Precinct No. 1;
R. E. THOMAS, COMMISSIONER, Precinct No. 2;
E. H. Wilson, COMMISSIONER, Precinct No. 3;
GEO. LUNSFORD, COMMISSIONER, Precinct No. 4;

being present, and, among other proceedings had by said Court, was the following:

Commissioner Geo Lunsford introduced the following order and moved its adoption by the Court:

WHEREAS, heretofore, to-wit: on the 28th day of June, 1935, the Commissioners' Court of Titus County, Texas, passed its certain order ratifying and confirming, approving and adopting that certain contract between said County and East Texas Tractor and Machinery Company, for the purchase of certain tractors, and authorized the issuance and delivery of THREE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$3,500.00) SIX PER CENTUM (6%) "TITUS COUNTY ROAD WARRANTS," dated June 29, 1935, to the said Company in part payment for the purchase price of said tractors, and which said order is of record in Book 5, pages 84 et seq., of the Minutes of this Court, and reference thereto is hereby made for a description of said tractors, and also, a description of said warrants; and,

WHEREAS, the aforesaid order levied a tax of and at the rate of TWO AND ONE-HALF CENTS (2½¢) on each one hundred dollars valuation of all taxable property in said County for the current year 1935; and,

WHEREAS, thereafter, to-wit: on the 9th day of September, 1935, this Court passed its annual tax order, and in said order levied for the year 1935 a tax of and at the rate of TEN AND ONE-HALF CENTS (10½¢) on each one hundred dollars' valuation of taxable property in said County to pay principal and interest of time warrants outstanding against the Road and Bridge Fund; it being the intent of this Court, in the levy of such tax, to provide for the levy of EIGHT AND ONE-HALF CENTS (8½¢) to pay principal and interest of \$9,500.00 outstanding warrants and TWO AND ONE-HALF CENTS (2½¢) to pay principal and interest of the said \$3,500.00 warrants, dated June 29, 1935, such order being of record in Book 5, page 76, of the Minutes of this Court; therefore,

BE IT ORDERED BY THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF TITUS COUNTY, TEXAS:

I.

That the said order of June 29, 1935, authorizing the issuance of THREE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$3,500.00) SIX PER CENTUM (6%) "TITUS COUNTY ROAD WARRANTS," dated June 29, 1935, to the EAST TEXAS TRACTOR AND MACHINERY COMPANY, in part payment of the purchase price of the tractors described in said Company's contract with the County, and levying the

tax to pay principal and interest of said warrants at maturity, be, and the same is hereby, ratified, approved and confirmed.

II.

That the EAST TEXAS TRACTOR AND MACHINERY COMPANY duly furnished said tractors in accordance with the terms of its contract, and the said tractors were duly received by the County and are now the property of the County.

The above order having been read, the motion of Commissioner R. L. Thomas for its passage was duly seconded by Commissioner L. H. Wilson. Thereupon, the question being called for, the County Judge put the motion to a vote of the members of the Commissioners' Court, and the motion carried by the following vote:

Commissioners Stringfellow, Thomas, Wilson and Lunsford voting "AYE"; and none voting "NO".

The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order duly passed and adopted, and the County Clerk was instructed to record the same in the Minutes of the Court.
