When County Commissioner T. J. Stringfellow offered the following order to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, and made a motion that the same be passed by said court, which motion was seconded by County Commissioner, G. C. Lunsford. The order is as follows, to-wit:

It appears to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that Highway No. 49 leading north from Mt. Pleasant, to Talco is inadequate to take care of the extra amount of traffic on said Highway caused by the discovery of oil in the northern part of Titus County; and that it is necessary to widen and repair the present road, and also build a new road leading in a northerly direction from Mt. Pleasant to Talco.

It is therefore ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that the right-of-way necessary to widen and straighten Highway No. 49 leading from Mt. Pleasant to Talco as now located, and the right-of-way necessary to build a new road leading from Mt. Pleasant to Talco, yet to be located by the Highway Department of Texas will be furnished by Titus County to the State Highway Department, provided, the said Highway department will build the roads as above described.

The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of said commissioners court of Titus County, Texas, with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No". Whereupon County Commissioners G. C. Lunsford, R. L. Thomas, L. H. Wilson and T. J. Stringfellow voted "Aye" None voted "No". The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.
