

Be it remembered that the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, met in regular session at the Court House of said county in the City of Mt. Pleasant, Texas, on April 13th 1936, with the following members present to wit:

G. T. Neugent, County Judge and Commissioners, G. C. Lunsford, T. J. Stringfellow, R. L. Thomas and L. H. Wilson,

When County Commissioner, T. J. Stringfellow offered the following order to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, and made a motion that the same be passed by said court, which motion was seconded by County Commissioner, G. C. Lunsford, The order is as follows, to wit:

It is ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that Minute No. 12052 as passed by the Highway Commission of Texas, dated March 17th, 1936, and amended by said Commission on April 8th, 1936, is hereby in all things accepted by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, It is further understood that the State Highway Commission is to advance to the County Commissioners Court the sum of \$6,000.00 to be applied on the purchase of right-of-way on Highway No. 1 as stated in the above mentioned minute, and we agree and bind Titus County to reimburse the State in three (3) equal annual payments on or before April 1st., of the years 1937, 1938 and 1939.

The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of said commissioners court of Titus County, Texas, with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No" Whereupon County Commissioner, G. C. Lunsford, L. H. Wilson, R. L. Thomas and T. J. Stringfellow all voted "Aye" None voted "NO". The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

April 13, 1936.

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus Co. Texas the Quarterly Report of G. W. McLenore when Com. C. C. Lunsford made a motion that the same be approved, Seconded by T. J. Stringfellow. The Co. Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of said Court. All members voted Aye. The Co. Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

On this the 13th day of April 1936, came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, the canvassing of the returns of the election of School Trustees, in the Common & Indpt. School Districts throughout Titus County, and the election of one County School Trustee in and for Commissioners Precinct No. 2, and the election of one County School Trustee in and for Commissioners Precinct No. 4 of Titus County, Texas, and one County School Trustee "At Large" in and for Titus County, Texas. Said election being held on April 4th, 1936.

It is ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that the following named parties received the highest number of votes for Trustee in the Common School Districts throughout Titus County, and are hereby declared duly elected to the office of Trustee in and for the following Common School Districts of Titus County, and all Independent School Districts of Titus Co.

WHEREUPON County Commissioner, Lunsford made a motion that the following order be passed by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, which motion was seconded by County Commissioner, Thomas,

The Order in words and figures is as follows, to-wit:

"It appears to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that L. B. Culbertson has filed with said Court has filed with said Court his petition praying that he be granted the privilege to lay pipes along and across the public roads, streets and alleys within the town of Talco, Texas, and its immediate vicinity for the purpose of supplying gas to the citizens of said town and vicinity for domestic and commercial uses; That there is a need for such enterprise in said town and vicinity, and that L. B. Culbertson is a proper person to entrust with such matter.

It is, therefore, ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that L. B. Culbertson be, and is now granted the franchise and privilege of establishing the business of supplying gas to the residents of Talco, Texas and its vicinity for domestic uses and that he is granted the privilege to lay and construct whatever pipe lines that shall be necessary and useful to accomplish said purposes across and along the public roads, streets and alleys in Talco, Texas, and its vicinity, and that he have such privilege and right for a term of twenty-five (25) years. L. B. Culbertson, however, shall have and exercise such right and privilege subject to all of the limitations and requirements now or hereafter provided by law and shall use said public roads, streets and alleys in strict conformity with the requirements and limitations now provided by law and those that may hereafter be provided by law, and shall not be privileged to violate or disregard in any way or particular any such requirements."

The County Judge of Titus County, Texas, put the said motion for a vote of the members of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, with the request that as many as favored

the motion would vote "A ye," and those opposed, "No," whereupon County Commissioners String-fellow, Thomas, Lunsford, and Wilson voted "Aye", and County Commissioners \_\_\_\_\_

The County Judge declared the motion carried and the Order passed.
