

Be it remembered that on this the 8th day of June 1936 the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, met in the regular session at the Court House of said county in the City of Mt. Pleasant, Texas with the following members present to wit: C. T. Neugent County Judge and G. C. Lunsford, T. J. Stringfellow, L. H. Wilson and R. L. Thomas Commissioners, when the following proceedings were had to wit:

On this day came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, the application of Loyd Graf, Constable of Precinct No. 3 Titus County, Texas, asking that John Tigert be appointed Deputy Constable of said precinct, when Commissioner G. C. Lunsford made a motion that the said application be granted, and that John Tigert be appointed Deputy Constable of Precinct No. 3 Titus County, Texas, and that his bond be in all things approved, which motion was seconded by Commissioner L. H. Wilson. The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of said court with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "Aye" and all those opposed to vote "No" County Commissioner G. C. Lunsford, L. H. Wilson, R. L. Thomas and T. J. Stringfellow all voted "Aye" The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

On this the 8th day of June 1936 came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, of H. E. Wilhite Justice of the Peace of Precinct No. 1, and the reports of E. C. Houston Justice of the Peace of Precinct No. 2 and 3 of Titus County, and the report of Jack Brown Justice of the Peace of Precinct No. 3 Titus County, Texas, when Commissioner G. C. Lunsford made a motion that said reports be approved, which motion was seconded by Commissioner T. J. Stringfellow, The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of said court with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No" All of said members voted "Aye" The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

On this the 8th day of June 1936 came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, the monthly report of I. L. Hays, Constable of Precinct No. 1 Titus County, Texas, when G. C. Lunsford made a motion that said report be approved, which motion was seconded by T. J. Stringfellow. The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of said court with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "Aye" and all those opposed to vote "No" All members of said court voted "Aye" The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

On this the 8th day of June 1936 came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, the petition of W. T. Sullivan and others asking that a Public Road be granted beginning near T. L. Leak's residence and running south on the land lines of W. T. Sullivan, W.H. Crawford, King and Hugnes, M. Hazelwood and Geo. Ward to connect with the Talco Mail Route No. 2, a distance of about one and one fourth mile. Commissioner R. L. Thomas made a motion that the above described road be granted, which motion was seconded by T. J. Stringfellow, The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of said court with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "Aye" and all those opposed to vote "No" All of said members voted "Aye" The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

The following motion was presented by Commissioner G. C. Lunsford, whereas, the Commissioners' Court of Titus County has given due notice of its intention to award a contract to audit the books and records of the County and its officials for the calendar year 1936, and in reply to such notice proposals of competent accountants were received and filed.

Whereas the proposal of Nolan C. Phillips & Co. of Waco, Texas, is, in the opinion of the Court, the best proposal submitted and it is the desire of the Commissioners' Court to employ Nolan C. Phillips & Company to audit the records of Titus County, therefore, be it resolved that the County Judge of Titus County be authorized and he is so instructed to enter into a contract with Nolan C. Phillips & Company to audit the records of Titus County in accordance with specifications submitted and on file in the office of the County Clerk and for the sum of FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$450.00), such contract to be made in and for Titus County, Texas, a municipal corporation.

After being duly seconded by Commissioner L.H. Wilson the foregoing resolution was passed with the following vote.

Lunsford, T. J. Stringfellow, R. L. Thomas and L. H. Wilson all voted "Aye" The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

On this the 8th day of June 1936 came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, the resignation of Elmer Cato as Deputy Sheriff of Titus County, Texas, when T. J. Stringfellow made a motion that the said resignation be in all things accepted. Commissioner G. C. Lunsford seconded the motion. The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of said court with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "Aye" and all those opposed to vote "No". County Commissioner G. C. Lunsford, L. H. Wilson, T. J. Stringfellow and R. L. Thomas vote "Aye" None voted No. The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

On this the 8th day of June 1936 came on to be considered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, the application of Q. C. Gaudis, Sheriff of Titus County, Asking that W. D. Cate be appointed Deputy Sheriff of Titus County, Texas, and is to receive for his services all of the legal fees earned by him in the performance of his official duties as Deputy Sheriff, provided, such fees does not exceed the limit allowed by law to Deputy Sheriffs.

Commissioner G. C. Lunsford made a motion that the said application be granted, which motion was seconded by L. H. Wilson. On this the 8th day of June 1936 came on to be considered the account of J. R. Phillips Investment Company of Houston, Texas, amounting to the sum of \$800.00 for services rendered in connection with the issuance of \$90,000 Titus County Road Refunding Bonds Series 1, and \$155,000 Titus County Road Refunding Bonds Series 2, when Commissioner G. C. Lunsford made a motion that J. R. Phillips Investment Company be allowed the sum of \$800.00 out of the Road-Bridge-Interest & Sinking Fund of Titus County, which motion was seconded by L. H. Wilson, The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of said court with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "aye" and those opposed to vote "no" All of said members voted "aye" The County Judge declared the motion carried.
