Honorable C. T. Neugent, County Judge, present and presiding, and present G. C. Lunsford, L. H. Wilson, R. L. Thomas, and T. J. Stringfellow Commissioners; also present Jack Cross, County Clerk, and Q. C. Gaddis, Sheriff of Titus County, Texas.

The following proceedings were had, to-wit:

In the matter of TEXAS POWER & LIGHT COMPANY, its successors and assigns, came regularly to be heard on this day the application of TEXAS POWER & LIGHT COMPANY, its successors and assigns, which was in writing and is as follows:

"Dallas, Texas,

July 13, 1936.

TO THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF TITUS COUNTY, TEXAS :

Your petitioner, Texas Power & Light Company, respectfully requests that the Commissioners' Court of Titus County, Texas, grant to it, its successors and assigns, the right, privilege and authority, for a period of Fifty (50) years from this date, to construct, maintain and operate suitable poles and/or towers on and/or across the public roads and highways of Titus County, Texas, for the purpose of supporting, its transmission and distribution lines of

electricity for light, heat, power and other purposes.

and said application having been heard and duly considered by the Court and evidence relative thereto having been presented, and the Court having been advised of all the facts is of the opinion that same should be allowed and the rights and privileges therein requested granted, subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter stated. It is therefore

ORDERED:

That the right, license, privilege and franchise is hereby granted to TEXAS POWER & LIGHT COMPANY, its successors and assigns, for a term of Fifty (50) years from the 10th day of July, 1936, to construct, maintain and operate suitable poles and/or towers on and/or across the public roads and highways of said County for the purpose of supporting its transmission and distribution lines of electricity for light, heat, power and other purposes; provided, however,

(1) That wires across or on the road shall be suspended at a height of not less than 22 feet from the surface of the ground, and in all cases where poles or towers are set on any part of the road, the same shall be set on the right of way of the road but as nearly as practicable to the outside boundary thereof, but in a straight line or curve corresponding to that of the main course of said road, and shall be maintained so that they will not lean so as to endanger or interfere with traffic along said road.

(2) In case of a change of said road, or change in the grade or drainage thereof, such poles or towers of Grantee as shall be located upon the right of way of said road as it existed prior to such change shall be reset or changed by the Grantee at its expense so as to conform thereto.

(3) Said electric lines, including poles, towers, wires, etc., shall at all times be kept and maintained in good condition and repair at the expense of the Grantee.

(4) The Grantee shall hold the County of Titus harmless from all expense or liability for any act or neglect by the Grantee hereunder.

(5) The rights, privileges and franchises hereby granted are not exclusive and nothing herein contained shall prevent the County of Titus from granting like, similar or different rights, privileges and franchises to any other person, firm or corporation.

(6) The aforesaid rights, privileges and franchises are granted only to the extent that the Commissioners' Court of Titus County, Texas, has legal power and authority so to do, and are subject to any primary or concurrent jurisdiction over any of the roads of said County possessed by the Highway Department of the State of Texas.

PLEASANT TIMES REVIEW on the following dates, to-wit: June 12, 1936, and June 26, 1936, and which said Notice is in words and figures as follows, to-wit:

"NOTICE TO BIDDERS

"ON this, the 11th day of May, 1936, the following order was issued, to-wit:

"THE Commissioners' Court of Titus County, Texas, will receive competitive bids to ten o'clock am on the 13th day of July, 1936, at the Court House at Mt. Pleasant, Texas, on the following described road machinery: One or more 45 horsepower crawler type tractor, complete standard equipment with canopy top and one or more ten-foot blade grader, complete standard equipment, and at the same time and place said Court will proceed to let a contract if any be accepted. Certified check in five per cent of the amount of bid is required, and the Court reserves the right to reject any or all bids.

"If any contract is made the Court intends to pay part cash and issue interest bearing warrants for the balance in the amount not to exceed \$8,000, said warrants to bear interest at the rate of six per cent per annum and said warrants to mature at a date not later than June 15, 1939.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That the County of Titus, Texas, acting herein by and through its COMMISSIONERS' COURT, hereinafter called the "COUNTY", and EAST TEXAS TRACTOR AND MACHINERY COMPANY, of TYLER, TEXAS, acting herein by and through D. M. McClure, its duly authorized Partner, hereinafter called "Contractor" have on this date entered into the following contract and agreement, to-wit:

I.

Pursuant to Notice to Bidders issued by the COUNTY for the purchase of one or more 45 horse-power crawler type tractors, complete standard equipment with canopy top, the County has on this date purchased from the Contractor two Allis-Chalmers Model WK Tractors with eighteen inch Grouser Tract Shoes, and Canopy Tops, serial numbers WK-4880 and WK-4893.

II.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that the purchase price of the said two tractors is \$2,984.50 each, making a total of \$5,969.00, payment therefor to be partly in cash, and by the issuance and delivery to the Contractor of interest-bearing time warrants on the faith and credit of the County, payable out of taxes levied for that purpose; the cash payment being \$1,289.00, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged by the Contractor, and the issuance and delivery of \$4,700.00 8% Road Warrants, payable serially, \$1,000.00 on May 15, 1937, \$2,500.00 on May 15th, 1938, and \$1,200.00 on May 15, 1939.

III.

The COUNTY hereby agrees to levy sufficient taxes to pay principal of and interest on said warrants so long as the same are outstanding and unpaid, in the time and manner prescribed by Statute.

I.

That the proposal or bid of East Texas Tractor and Machinery Company, of Tyler, Texas, for sale and delivery to the County of Two Allis-Chalmers Model WK Tractors with eighteen inch Grouser Tract Shoes, and Canopy Tops, Serial Numbers WK-4880 and WK-4893, shall be, and the same is hereby, formally approved and accepted.

II.

That the contract made and entered into by and between this Court and the said East Texas Tractor and Machinery Company in respect of the sale and delivery of such tractors, is hereby ratified, confirmed, approved and adopted, and declared to be a legal contract of this County, and shall have effect according to its tenor and purport.

III.

That the said tractors, and each of them, having been delivered to the County, pursuant to the terms of the aforesaid contract, and having been duly inspected by this Court and found in all respects satisfactory and well worth the price agreed upon in said contract,

the same are hereby accepted and declared to be the property of Titus County, Texas, and the said County has received full value and consideration for the price to be paid the said East Texas Tractor and Machinery Company for said tractors.

IV.

That, pursuant to the aforesaid published Notice of Bidders, and in accordance with said contract, there shall be issued the warrants of said County, to be called "TITUS COUNTY ROAD WARRANTS," in the total principal sum of FOUR THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$4,700.00), under authority of the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas.

V.

That said Warrants shall be dated the 13th day of July, 1936, shall be numbered from One (1) to Six (6), both inclusive, and shall be in denomination of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) each, except that Warrant 2, due May 15, 1938, shall be for \$500.00, and Warrant Number 5 due on May 15, 1939, shall be for \$200.00, aggregating in amount FOUR THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$4,700.00), and shall be issued and delivered to the said East Texas Tractor and Machinery Company, of Tyler, Texas, in part payment for the purchase price of the tractors hereinabove described, and in accordance with the contract with the said Company, and said warrants shall become due and payable serially in accordance with the following schedule:
