It is ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that minute No. 12826 as passed by the Highway Commission of Texas, dated September 22nd, 1936, wherein the Highway Commission of Texas agreed to advance to Titus County the sum of \$3,000. to be applied on the purchase of right-of-way on Highway No. 1 as stated in the above mentioned minute, and we agree and bind Titus County to reimburse the State Highway Commission in three equal annual payments on or before April lat, 1957, 1938 and 1939.

The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of said court with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "Aye" and all those opposed to vote "No". County Commissioners, G. C. Lunsford, T. J. Stringfellow, R. L. Thomas and L. H. Wilson all voted "Aye" None voted "No". The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.
