IN THE MATTER OF APPLICATION OF HUMBLE PIPE LINE COMPANY FOR RIGHTS OF WAY.

On the 13 day of Jan. 1937 came on to be considered by the Commissioners' Court of Titus County, Texas, all members of said Court being present, the application of Humble Pipe Line Company for right-of-way and easement privileges for the purposes of constructing, maintaining and operating pipe lines on, under, across and along the public roads and highways in Titus County, Texas, and also on, under, across and along all streets and alleys in any unincorporated towns in said County, for the purpose of transporting petroleum oil, gas, water or other solutions, and the said application having been duly considered by this court and this court being of the opinion the same should be granted, it is ordered by the court, so adjudged and decreed that the said right-of-way and easement privileges for the above purposes be granted to said Humble Pipe Line Company, its successors and assigns, upon the following terms and conditions, viz:

That the said Humble Pipe Line company shall at its own expense keep any pipe line or lines constructed under this grant buried in a manner so as not to interfere in any manner with any traffic along the said roads, streets and alleys, or any of them, and shall maintain all pipe lines at and along all such highways in such conditions that the same will not leak and thereby impair such roads or interfere with travel, and shall keep all roads at points where the pipe lines are laid in as good condition for travel as at the time excavations are made for burying such pipe line or lines and shall leave no loose dirt or other material which will impair the said roads, but shall pack all dirt at such points to at least the consistency as the said roads were before such excavations were made, and in the

event the said road is hard surfaced at such place, the same character of hard surfacing material shall be placed thereon and the road brought up to the same standard of sufficiency as same was in at date of excoavation. Said repair of County roads to fully meet with the requirements and the approval of said Commissioners of Titus County, Texas.

It is also stipulated and required that except at crossings, pipe lines shall only be laid along that portion of the right-of-way not used for travel and along that margin of said right-of-way not used for travel and along that margin of said right of way so as not to interfere with travel, drainage or the working of said roads.

Said Humble Pipe Line Company is also given similar right-of-way and easement along, upon, and across all public highway in this County, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining telegraph and telephone lines and other wire lines in connection with the operation of said pipe lines. Said poles and lines shall be so placed and constructed as not to interfere in any wise with the use of said highways by the public. Wherever any wire line shall cross a highway, same shall be placed at a minimum height of 20 feet above the level of the surfact of said highway.

It is expressly provided and understood that the Humble Pipe Line Company, in accepting, and in operating under this franchise and permit, is and shall be bound by all of the terms and provisions of this order.
