The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the Commissioners' Court with the request that as many as favored it vote "Aye", and those opposed to vote "No". County Commissioners Stringfellow, Cody, Brown, and Lunsford all voted "Aye" None voted "No". The County Judge Declared the motion carried and the order passed.

Be it remembered that at a regular session of the Commissioners Court of Titus County Texas, Feb. 8, 1937, the following proceedings were had:

County Commissioner Geo. Lunaford made a motion that bids be considered for the Depository of the various County Funds and also of the various County Funds and also of the School Funds and also of the School Funds, having made the highest bid, of one ($\frac{1}{4}$) fourth of one (1) per cent, on the average deposits.

It is therefore ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners' Court that the First National Bank be selected as the highest bidder, and the Depository of the various County Funds and also of the School Funds for the next two years and that the First National Bank pay one fourth of one per cent to the County as interest on the daily balances.

Thereupon there came on to be considered the matter of changing the boundaries of Commissioner's Precincts Nos. 3 and 4;

Commissioner G. C. Lunsford offered the following order and moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner T. J. Stringfellow.

The motion carrying with it the adoption of the order prevailed by the following votes:

Ayes: Commissioner Stringfellow, Cody and Lunsford.

Noes: Commissioner Brown.

Thereupon, the County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed and adopted.

The order is as follows:

An order of the Commissioner's Court of Titus County, Texas changing the boundaries of Commissioner's Precinct Nos. 3 and 4 of said county so that the voting precinct No. 10 of said county, commonly referred to as the Argo voting precinct, and heretofore situated in Commissioners Precinct No. 4 will be taken out of said Commissioner's Precinct No. 4 and added to Commissioner's Precinct No. 3.

BE IT ORDERED by the Commissioner's Court of Titus County, Texas:

That the following territory comprising voting Precinct No. 10 in Titus County, Texas commonly known as The Argo Voting Precinct, to-wit:

BEGINNING where the Mt. Pleasant-Harts Bluff road crosses White Oak Creek; THENCE SOUTH with the Harts Bluff Road to Oak Grove Church; THENCE EAST with the Oak Grove and Liberty Hall Road to where said road crosses Horse Creek; THENCE NORTH-EAST with the meanderings of Horse Creek to where it runs into White Oak Creek; THENCE in a westerly direction with the meanderings of White Oak Creek to the Harts Bluff Bridge on said creek, the place of beginning; and heretofore included in and being a part of Commissioner's Precinct No. 4, be and it hereby taken out of said Commissioners Precinct No. 4 of Titus County, Texas and made a part of Commissioner's Precinct No. 3 of Titus County, Texas; and that the boundaries of said Commissioner's Precinct No. 3 be and they are hereby changed in such manner as will include the above mentioned territory; and that the boundaries of said Commissioner's Precinct No. 4 be and they are hereby changed so that they will not hereafter include the above described territory; and that except for the changes hereinabove ordered, the boundaries of said Commissioner's Precincts Nos. 3 and 4 of said Titus County, Texas will remain as they were prior to the passage of this order.
