Be it remembered that on this the 17th day of February 1937, the Commissioners' Court of Titus County, Texas, met in a special session at the Court House of said County in the City of Mt. Pleasant, Texas, with the following members present to wit:

C. T. Neugent, County Judge and County Commissioners G. C. Lunsford, T. J. Stringfellow, W. J. Cody and Ernest Brown, when County Commissioner G. C. Lunsford offered the following order to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, and made a motion that the same be passed by said court, which motion was seconded by County Commissioner, T. J. Stringfellow. The order is as follows, to-wit: That Joe Riddle, Jean Mankins, and Joe Riddle, Jr and such other employees of Titus County as the Commissioners Court may direct, be instructed by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, to begin work grading and maintaining the roads of said Argo Voting Precinct No. 10, which is a part of Commissioners Precinct No. 3 of Titus County, Texas, and doing such other work on said roads as is required to keep them in a passable condition, similar to the remaining roads of Titus County.

And that upon failure of Joe Riddle, Jean Mankins and Joe Riddle Jr., and such other employees of Titus County as the Commissioners Court may direct to follow the above instructions, they are dismissed from the employment of Titus County and the Clerk of this court is hereby instructed to issue no more warrants to any employees of Titus County, Texas for labor, only upon the approval of a majority of said Commissioners Court of Titus County of such labor bills.

The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of said commissioners court with the request that as many as favored the motion to vote "Aye" and all those opposed to vote "No". County Commissioners G. C. Lunsford, T. J. Stringfellow and W. J. Cody all voted "Aye" and County Commissioner Ernest Brown voted "No". The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

The above minutes read and approved in open court.

---SPECIAL SESSION---

On this the 17th day of February, 1937, at a special session of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, County Judge C. T. Neugent presiding and all members being present and voting, the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

Bond of Clyde Keith, Amount \$1,000.00, Payable to G. R. Ard, Sureties: Q. C. Gaddis, W. E. Haggard.

Bond of Melvin Wooten, Amount \$1,000.00, Payable to G. R. Ard, Sureties: O. L. Taylor, Verne Adams, & Edgar Hoffman.

The County Judge put the motion for a vote of the members of said court with the request that as many as favored it vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No". County Commissioners Lunsford, Stringfellow, Cody and Brown all voted "Aye". None voted "No". The County Judge declared the motion carried.
