IT APPERRING that J. R. Phillips Investment Company of Houston, Texas, has offered to well to the Titus County road sinking fund \$5000 Road District No. 1 Bonds, bearing 5% interest, dated Merch 15, 1916, Numbers 161 to 165 inclusive, due March 15, 1949, and it further appearing that by the purchase of eaid bonds a saving of \$1,575.00 will be affected by Titus County;

THEREFORE, upon motion made by Commissioner T. L. Garrett and seconded by Commissioner Ernest Brown and unanimously approved by the Commissioners present, the County Treasurer is hereby authorized to purchase the said bonds and pay the sum of \$6,125.00 out of Titus County Road Bond sinking fund to J. R. Phillips Investment Company, upon being presented with the above described bonds for payment.

IN THE MATTER OF CANVASSING ELECTION RETURNS ON COURT HOUSE BOND ELECTION:

Be it remembered that the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, met in a regular session thereof, at the Court House of eald County, on the 11th. day of April A.D. 1959, with the following members present, to wit:

County Judge, C. T. Neugent, and County Commissioners, Garrett, Cody, Brown and Lunsford.

County Commissioner, Lunsford, offered the following order to the Commissioners
Court of Titus County, Texas, and made a motion that the same be passed by the Court, which
motion was ecconded by County Commissioner, Cody. The order is to wit:

"It appears to the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that a special election was held in and throughout Titus County, Texas, at the various voting precincts and places of election therein on the lat. day of April A.D. 1939, at which there was submitted to the resident property taxpaying voters of said County, Texas, question of the issuance of the Coupon Bonds of said County to the amount of \$160,000.00 for the purpose of contructing permanent improvements, a court house in said County; That returns of said election have been made by the election officers having held the said election; and that from said returns it appears that there were cast at said election 1715 votes; of which number were cast "for the issuance of bonds" 313 votes and that there were cast "against the issuance of bonds" 1408 votes; and that a majority of the votes cast at said election were cast against the issuance of bonds:

It is therefore, ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that a majority of the votes cast at said election were cast against the issuance of bonds as voted upon and submitted in the said election and that by reason thereof this court does not have authority to issue said bonds."

The County Judge put the said motion for a vote of the members of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, with the request that as many as favored the motion would vote "AYE" and those opposed to vote "NO". Whereupon County Commissioners, Gerrett, Cody, Brown and Lunsford voted "AYE". Mons voted "NO". The County Judge declared the motion carried and the order passed.

C. T. Neugent County Judge IN THE MATTER OF FURCHASING \$30,000 TITUS COUNTY R & B FUNDING BONDS:

TO THE HONORABLE COUNTY JUDGE AND COMMISSIONERS' COUNTY OF TITUS COUNTY, TEXAS.

## Gen tl emen:

In econection with the \$30,000 TITUS COUNTY 42% ROAD AND BRIDGE FUNDING BONDS which are now in process of being issued to take up and refund a like amount of Titus County Road and Bridge 52% and 6% Warrante maturing at various times during 1939, 1940 and 1941, we wish to submit for your consideration the following proposal:

In checking the sinking funds of the county-wide road bond issues there appears to be a considerable surplus of money to the credit of these issues. In view of the good financial sandition of these road bond issues and the present high bond market has made it impossible to secure additional road bonds as an investment for these surplus sinking funds at reasonable prices. Under the present banking laws, you depository bank is unable to pay you any interest whatever on these surplus funds.

Therefore, we offer as an investment for these surplus funds the \$30,000 Titus County Road and Bridge Funding Bonds, dated February 10, 1939, on the following schedule of prices:

To these prices there is to be added the accrued interest from the date of the bonds to the date of delivery of the said bonds to the sinking fund. The accrued interest so paid will revert to the credit of the sinking fund of the road and bridge issue, because proper interest adjustments will be made at the time or times that the bonds are actually delivered to us by the State Comptroller in exchange for the 5% and 6% warrants outstanding.

The above prices are in line with the present provailing market and in proportion to what we will have to pay in order to secure the 5% and 6% warrants for refunding purposes.

The bonds are to be delivered to you as an investment for the county-wide sinking fund as we have obtained the old warrants for exchange and on the approving opinion of the Attorney General of the State of Texas.

We are to be given a period of Four (4) months in which to deliver the \$50,000 456 Refunding Bonds to the county-wide einking fund without any change in prices. If we have not made delivery of the bonds maturing in 1940, 1941 and 1942 by that time proper price adjustments will be made for the lapse of time.

This proposal end offer to sall the above described bonds does not affect our agreement in connection with the refunding of the \$50,000 warrants into a like amount of the refunding bonds.
