when came on to be considered the petition of A. S. Mitchell and 283 others requesting the County Board of School Trustees and Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, to submit to the resident property tax paying voters of Titus County, Texas, (at the same time the question is submitted to the qualified voters of Titus County, Texas, the question of the creation of Junior College District, the boundaries of which are to be the same and co-extensive with Titus County, Texas,) the question of the levy, assessment and collection of a tax not to exceed 20¢ upon each and every \$100.00 valuation of taxable property within said county and proposed created district, in the event the qualified voters of said county vote to create said district. The taxes so levied, assessed and collected are to be used by said Junior College District, in the event the same is created, for the purpose of construction and/or maintenance and/or equipment and/or purchase of school buildings and grounds; and said School Board proceeded to inquire into the qualifications of those signing the said petition find that 284 of the number signing the same are resident property tax-paying voters of Titus County, Texas, and that said number so signing are more than sufficient number as required under the law, being more than 10% of the resident qualified tax-paying voters of said county, and said body further finds that said petition is in proper and legal form and that the same are genuine. Whereupon Member S. A. Thomas offered the following resolution and moved that the same be adopted; which motion was seconded by Member E. C. Sims, the resolution being as follows:

WHEREAS, A. S. Mitchell and 283 others have on this day petitioned the County Board of School Trustees of Titus County, Texas, and the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, to submit to the resident property tax paying voters of Titus County, Texas, the question of the levy, assessment and collection of a tax not to exceed 20¢ upon each and every \$100.00 valuation of taxable property within Titus County, Texas, at the same time the question is submitted to the qualified voters of said county for the creation of a Junior College District, the boundaries of which are to be the same and co-extensive with Titus County, Texas; said tax to be levied in the event said district is authorized to be created by the qualified voters. The tax so levied, assessed and collected is to be used by said Junior College District, in the event the same is created, for the purpose of construction and/or equipment and/or maintenance and/or purchase of school buildings and grounds; and

WHEREAS, after and examination of the tax rolls of Titus County, Texas, said Board finds that there are 284 signers of said petition who are resident qualified property tax

paying voters of Titus County, Texas, and that said number is more than the 10% required by law to submit such a proposition; and

WHEREAS, said Board finds that said petition is in legal form and that the same is genuine;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordered by the County Board of School Trustees of Titus County, Texas, that said petition be approved in all things and that a certified copy of this order be transmitted to the Commissioners court of Titus County, Texas."

Whereupon the President of said board put the question of the adoption of the resolution to a vote and requested all the members that favored the adoption of the same to vote "AYE" and all opposed to vote "NO". Whereupon Members M. A. Thomas, A. A. White, E. C. Sims voted "AYE" and Members NONE voted "NO".

Whereupon Commissioner Lunsford offered the following order for the consideration of the Court, and Commissioner Cody moved its adoption. The order being as follows:

"WHEREAS, in conformity with Sec. 18 of Art. 2815E, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, 1925, W. E. Wilson and 250 others did present to the County Board of School Trustees of Titus County, Texas, their petition requesting the submission of the proposition to the qualified voters of Titus County, Texas, the creation of a Junior College District, the boundaries of which are the same and co-extensive with Titus County, Texas; and

WHEREAS, the County Board of School Trustees of Titus County, Texas, did upon the

29 day of May, 1939, pass upon the legality and genuineness of said petition, and by order entered on said date did find that the same had the required number of signers as required by law and declared the same legal and that the same is genuine, and a copy of which order was transmitted to the State Board of Education of the State of Texas, and

WHEREAS, at a meeting of the State Board of Education of the State of Texas, held in Austin, Texas, on the 5 and 6 day of June, 1939, said State Board of Education did approve the request for the establishment of the said Junior College, as is shown by Minutes of the State Board of Education now on file in the Minutes of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas; and

WHEREAS, on the 12th day of June, A.D. 1939 A. S. Mitchell and 283 others did present their petition to the County Board of School Trustees of Titus County, requesting the approval of said petition upon the question of the submission to the qualified tax-paying voters of Titus County, Texas, the proposition of the levy, assessment and collection of a tax not to exceed 20¢ upon each and every \$100.00 valuation of taxable property within said county and proposed created Junior College District, to be used for the purpose of construction and/or maintenance and/or equipment and/or purchase of school buildings and grounds, in the event said proposed Junior College District is authorized to be created; said proposition to be voted upon at the same time the question is submitted on the creation of the Junior College District; and

WHEREAS, on said date the County Board of School Trustees of Titus County, Texas, did by order passed by said Board, all of which is fully shown in the Minutes of said Board, a certified copy of which is on file in the Minutes of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, approve said petition finding that 284 of the said signers of the same to be resident qualified tax-paying voters of Titus County, Texas, and that said number is 10% of the resident qualified tax-paying voters of Titus County, Texas, and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, has examined said petition and finds that the same has the required number of signers, being 284 of the resident tax-paying voters of Titus County, Texas, all of which is fully shown by order passed by said court on this date and entered in the Minutes of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, and which order is made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, there was filed in the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, on the 20th day of June, 1939, the petition of G. G. Proctor and 140 others requesting that the names of Geo. Lillianstern, T. C. Walker, O. S. Maxton, Raymond Brown, W. O. Tittle, Edgar Huffman, Lee Thompson, L. O. Holloway, Clayton (Pete) Gaddis, Dr. Kenneth Taylor and T. O. Raney be submitted to a ballot of the qualified voters of Titus County, Texas, for the selection of seven of said number to be Trustees of said Junior College District, in the event the same is authorized by the qualified voters of said County, the election of the said seven Trustees to be held at the same time the question of the creation of the said District is submitted to the voters of said county; and

WHEREAS, by order entered by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, on the 24th day of June, A.D. 1939, said court did approve said petition of G. G. Proctor and 140 others, and found that 141 of these signing the said petition were resident qualified tax-paying voters of Titus County, Texas, and that said number is more than the 25 required by law to authorize the submission of the names of the persons to be voted upon as trustees;

NOW

BE IT THEREFORE ORDERED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT of Titus County, Texas, that

an election be held in Titus County, Texas, on the 15th day of July, A.D. 1939, which date is not less than 30 days from the date of this order nor more than 30 days from the date of this order, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of said county the proposition of the creation of a Junior College District, the boundaries of which are to be the same and co-extensive with Titus County, Texas; and the further proposition of the election of a governing Board consisting of seven members, in the event said proposed Junior College District is created; and the further proposition of the submission to the qualified voters of Titus County, Texas, the question of the levy, assessment and collection of a tax not to exceed 20¢ upon each and every \$100.00 valuation of taxable property within said county and/or proposed created district for the purpose of construction and/or equipment and/or maintenance and/or purchase of school buildings and grounds, in the event said Junior College District is created.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that said election shall be held under the provisions of Chapter 13 of Title 49, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, 1925, and amendments thereto, relating to Independent School Districts, and the Junior College Districts, and the manner of holding such election and making and canvassing returns thereof shall be governed by General Laws of the State of Texas, when not in conflict herewith.

Such election shall be held at the regular voting places in all the election precincts in Titus County, as hereinafter set out, and such voting places and election officers therefor are as follows:

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that the ballots for the election of the Board of Trustees of said Junior College District, in the event the same is created, have printed thereon the names of Geo. Lillienstern, T. C. Walker, O. S. Maxton, Raymond Brown, W. O. Tittle, Edgar Huffman, Lee Thompson, L. O. Holloway, Clayton (Pete) Gaddis, Dr. Kenneth Taylor, and T. O. Raney, with the instruction at the top of the ballot; "SEVEN TO BE ELECTED".

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that the ballots for the levy, assessment and collection of the tax not to exceed 20¢ upon each and every \$100.00 valuation of taxable property within the limits of the proposed Junior College District to be used for the purpose of construction and/or maintenance and/or equipment and/or purchase of school buildings and grounds, in the event the same is created, have printed thereon the words:

"FOR MAINTENANCE TAX"

"AGAINST MAINTENANCE TAX".

Said propositions shall be voted upon by the resident qualified tax paying voters of Titus County, Texas.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that G. R. Ard, Sheriff, Titus County, Texas, post notices of said election, as required by law, at three public places in Titus County, Texas, one of which shall be at the Courthouse in Mt. Pleasant, Texas, for a period of at least 10 days prior to said election, and make due return thereof."

Whereupon the County Judge put the question of the adoption of said order to a vote of the Commissioners Court, instructing all who were in favor of said order to vote "AYE" and all opposed to vote "NO". Whereupon Commissioners Lunsford, Cody, Garrett and Brown voted "AYE" and Commissioners, NOBLE voted "NO". The County Judge declared the motion carried.
