## ORDER DESIGNATING WARRANTS TO BE REFUNDED

On the 14 day of Aug., 1939, the Commissioners' Court of Titus County, Texas, convened in regular session at a regular term of said Court with all members thereof present, viz:

and passed the following order:

IT APPEARS that heretofore on the 10th day of July, 1939, this Court made and entered an order authorizing the issuance of \$50,000.00 TITUS COUNTY Road and Bridge Refunding Bonds Series of 1939, for the purpose of refunding any \$50,000.00 of the \$40,700.00 Road and Bridge Warrants and Road Machinery Warrants, described in said order.

IT NOW APPEARS that the particular warrants making up the \$50,000.00 to be refunded should be more particularly described.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED BY THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF TITUS COUNTY, TEXAS:

That the particular warrants to be refunded by the issuance of the \$50,000.00 Titus County Road and Bridge Refunding Bonds, Series of 1939, as provided in said order, be and the same are hereby designated and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

- \$2,000 R & B Funding 6% Warrants, dated March 15, 1929, due March 15, 1939.
- \$1,000 R & B 6% Warrant, dated June 29, 1935.
- \$1,000 R & B 6% Warrant, Dated July 13, 1936, due May 15, 1939.
- \$5,000 R & B 5-1/2% Warrants, dated March 15, 1937, due \$2,000 March 15, 1939; \$3,000 March 15, 1940.
- \$1,000 R & B 5-1/2% Warrant, dated May 10, 1937, due May 10, 1939.
- \$9,000 Road Machinery 6% Warrants, dated July 13, 1937, due \$3,000 July 15, 1939; \$3,000 July 15, 1940; \$3,000 July 15, 1941.
- \$1,000 Road Machinery 6% Warrant, Series II of 1937; dated August 10, 1937, due August 10, 1939. (Called Series III in the Refunding Order)
- \$10,000 Road Machinery 5% Warrants, dated May 10, 1939, due \$1,000 May 10, 1940; \$3,000 May 10, 1941; \$3,000 May 10, 1942; \$3,000 May 10, 1943.

The foregoing order was read and it was moved by Commissioner LUNSFORD and seconded by Commissioner BROWN that it be passed, and upon the question being called it was unanimously passed, Commissioners LUNSFORD, BROWN, CODY and GARRETT voting AYE; and no one voting NO.

and the motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Commissioner Lunsford and seconded by Commissioner Garrett to approve the monthly expense accounts of Floyd Keith, District Clerk, for the months of June and July. All voted "aye" and the motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Commissioner Brown and seconded by Commissioner Garrett to approve the monthly expense account of G. R. Ard, Sheriff. All voted "aye" and the motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Commissioner Lunsford and seconded by Commissioner Garrett to approve the monthly expense account of P. O. Wilhite, Tax Assessor-Collector. All voted "aye" and the motion carried unanimously.

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IN THE MATTER OF INVESTMENT OF FUNDS OF PERMANENT SCHOOL FUND OF TITUS COUNTY, TEXAS:

Be it remembered that the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, met in regular session at the Court House of Titus County on the 14th. day of August A.D. 1939, with the following members present, to wit: C. T. Neugent County Judge, County Commissioners Garrett, Gody, Brown and Lunsford.

When came on to be considered the matter of investing the permanent School Fund of Titus County, Texas, in the School House Bonds of Maple Springs Common School District No. 2 of Titus County, Texas, when the following order was unanimously passed by said Court.

It is order, adjudged and decreed by the Commissioners County of Titus County, Texas, that Bond No. 17 of Common School District No. 2 of Titus County, Texas, in denomination of \$1,250.00 be purchased with the funds of the Permanent School Fund of Titus County, Texas, as in investment for said fund. The Clerk of this Court will issue warrant for said amount and the Treasurer for Titus County, Texas, will receive the said bond and pay for the same.

The foregoing order passed by the unanimous vote of the members of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas.

The foregoing minutes of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, read and approved this the 14th. day of August A.D. 1939.

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IN THE MATTER OF DISCOUNTS ON EARLY PAYMENT OF TAXES in Titus County:

The Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, in Regular Session on August 14, 1939, with a majority of said Court present, when Commissioner Lunsford offered the following resolution; and moved its adoption, to wit:

"Be it resolved by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, that in conformity with Senate Bill No. 402, 48th Leg. Regular Session, that any taxpayer owing taxes on any property located in Titus County, Texas, real, personal, or mixed, to the State of Texas, Titus County, or any common school district, shall be allowed a discount of 3% on said taxes provided that the same are paid during the months of October for the year in which said taxes are assessed; and shall be allowed a discount of 2% on said taxes provided the same are paid during the month of November for the year in which said taxes are assessed; and shall be allowed a discount of 1% on said taxes provided the same are paid in the month of December in the year for which said taxes are assessed.

Be it further resolved that no discount shall be allowed except such as is provided herein, and that no discount shall be allowed where the taxpayer splits the payment of the taxes as is provided by law.

Be it further resolved that this order shall be effective on and from the 14 day of September, A.D. 1939."

The County Judge placed the adoption of said resolution to a vote of the Commissioners Court, and Commissioners Garrett, Coody, Lunsford and Brown voted "AYE" and none voted "NO" and the county Judge declared the motion carried.
