WHEREAS, it is contemplated that said County will receive about the month of April 1940, prior thereto and thereafter, certain funds and monies as its part or partion due for automobile licenses and registrations in said County for said year, and it will become a part of the Road and Bridge Fund of said County.

NOW, THERFORE, be, and it is, hereby ordered by the Commissioners' Court of Titus County, Texas, that there be and is hereby pledged unto The First Mational Bank in Mt.

Pleasant, Texas, its successors and assigns, the funds that may be collected from current revenues during the year 1959, and/or the first monies and revenues due and owing and that may be paid and collected as the County's part or portion of the automobile licensee and/or registrations for and on automobiles or other motor vehicles paid in said County for the year 1940 from and with which to re-pay eaid Bank for the amounte of the above mentioned scrip warrants, with interest as herein provided, which said Bank has paid, or may hereafter pay, to the holders thereof; and the said Commissioners' Court hereby obligates said County to pay unto the said the First National Bank in Mt. Pleasant, Texas, its successors and assigns, the amount of its aforesaid scrip warrants obligations which said Bank has paid or may hereafter pay unto the holders thereof, together with interest upon each of said warrants from the date of the paying of same by said Bank to the holders thereof at the rate of 6% per annum.

Motion was made by Commissioner Lunsford and seconded by Commissioner Brown to approve the monthly expense account of G. R. Ard, Sheriff; being \$350.00 for salaries, \$2.00 for postage, \$2.00 for telephons-telegraph, \$65.24 for auto expenses; \$110.98 for groceries for jail; \$22.00 for cook; totaling \$552.22. All voted "Aye" and the account was unanimously approved.

Motion was made by Commissioner Linsford and accorded by Commissioner Brown to approve the monthly expense account of Morris Rolston, County Attorney; being \$15.00 for making a total of \$20.00; traveling expenses, \$2.00 for stamps, and \$3.00 miscellaneous office expenses; All voted "aye" and the account was unanimously approved.

Motion was made by Commissioner Lunsford and seconded by Commissioner Brown to approve the monthly expense account of P. O. Wilhite, Tax Assessor-Collector; being \$336.00 for salaries; \$17.47 for postage, and \$22.75 for miscellaneous office expenses; totaling \$376.22. IN THE MATTER OF ALLOWING CRICLER PAYMENT OF ESTIMATE No. 2, and FRED E. HESS COMMISSION:

Motion was made by Commissioner Lunsford and seconded by Commissioner Brown to allow the Contractor and Engineer's Estimate to be paid: C. L. Crigler, \$13,984.08, and Fred E. Hess. \$498.44. All voted "aye" and the motion carried unanimously.

IN THE MATTER OF APPROVING C. N. BURT COMPANY PROPOSAL:

Motion was made by Commissioner Lunsford and seconded by Commissioner Carrett to approve the proposal of C. N. Burt Co., as given below. All voted "aye" and the motion carried unanimously. The proposal is as follows:

TO THE HONORABLE COUNTY JUDGE AND COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF TITUS COUNTY, TEXAS.

We understand that you have obtained a grant from the Works Progress Administration in the approximate amount of \$177,000.00 for lateral road construction and improvement. You have explained to us that it will be difficult for the county to sponsor these projecte from the revenues available to the Road and Bridge Fund and at the same time maintain the other lateral roads throughout the county as they should be maintained.

We have discussed with you the possibility of issuing warrants against the Road & Bridge Fund to pay a part of the county's part of eponsoring these Works Administration Projects.

Therefore, in connection therewith , we wish to cubmit for your consideration the following proposal:

We will have prepared by a competent bond attorney and furnish you with an order authorizing the publication of a notice of the county's intention to issue, not to exceed \$20,000.00 of warrants. We will then furnish an order authorizing the proposed warrants, furnish the printed warrants, and secure their approval by a commercial bond attorney.

After the issue of warrants has been properly authorized, the county will then issue to parties furnishing material, equipment, labor and services, claims against the authorized warrant issue. We agree to assemble at par value, the claims so authorized, and after \$5,000 to \$10,000 are so assembled, they will be exchanged for like amounts of the time warrants.

The proposed warrants are to bear interest at a rate of 5% per annum; payable semiannually and maturing over a pariod of not to exceed fifteen years to best fit the financial condition of the Road & Bridge Fund.

For the foregoing services we are to be paid a fee of 2% of the principal amount of Wts. sotually issued and delivered to us in lieu of claims, which fee is to be due and payable simultaneously with the exchanges of the claims for the time warrants.

We are to have the option of holding all of said warrants until all of them shall have been issued, at which time we may convert them into Refunding Bonds without additional coat to the county.
