IN THE MATTER OF APPROVING MONTHLY REPORTS (March, 1940):

Motion was made by Commissioner Brown and seconded by Commissioner Cody to approve the monthly report of Chas. W. Robinson, Justice of the Peace. All voted "aye" and the motion carried unanimously.

Four Wheel Tandem Drive with 4 - 12.75" x 24" low pressure rear tires, wide front axle with leaning front wheels and 7.00x24" front tires and all plain tubes. Monomember box section frame and high bank sloping feature, as originally designed and introduced by us.

Payments to be made in legally issued Road and Bridge Titus County warrants on orders and proceedings which you agree to pass at the first regular meeting of the court after arrival and delivery of the machinery. Lithographed warrants to be furnished by us and all expenses of furnishing lithographed warrants to be paid by us. Warrants to contain a clause that the principal and interest after maturity shall bear interest at the rate of ten per cent per annum and ten per cent attorney's fees in the event it is necessary to place the warrants or interest coupons in the hands of an attorney for collection.

We enclose herewith a certified or cashier's check for \$500.00 and will furnish a bond, if required, issued by a surety company authorized to do business in the State of Texas for the amount of the contract.
