IN THE MATTER OF APPROVING REPORT OF JURY OF VIEW ON FUBLIC ROAD IN PRE. 2:

THE STATE OF TEXAS | COUNTY OF TITUS |

On this the 11th day of November, 1940 came on to be heard at a regular term of the Commissioners' Court of Titus County the report of the Jury of View appointed to lay out and survey a read beginning at a point about 3½ miles North of Winfield, Texas near the residence of Bascom Brown where a present existing road running generally in a North-Easterly direction to the Winfield-Bridges Chapel road approximately 4 miles away intersects with the Winfield-Daphne road, and terminating at the point aforesaid where eaid present existing road runs into or intersects the eaid Winfield-Bridges Chapel road near the NE corner of the old Watson place, said road being in Commissioners' Precinct No. 2 in Titus County, and the same have been duly considered by said Court, it is ordered that said report be approved, and that said road be, and it is, hereby established and that the field notes of said survey and description of said road be, and they are, hereby recorded in the Minutes of this Court, to-wit:

Said road to be 30 feet in width, being 25 feet on each side of the center line of the said public road: BEGINNING at the point above mentioned; THENCE with the center line of the present existing road on the ground above mentioned EASTERLY to the WB line of the B. F. Hunnicutt tract; THENCE with said center line across the said Hunnicutt tract in an EASTERLY direction to the WB line of the Connor Broa. tract; THENCE with said center line WESTERLY through the Hunnicutt tract to the NW corner of said Connor Bros. tract; THENCE with said center line NORTHLY through said Hunnicutt tract to the SB line of the Bessie Lee tract; THENCE with said center line NORTHLY across the said Lee tract to Bill Beck's SB line; THENCE with said center line NORTHERLY across the Beck's tract to Bill Beck's NB line; THENCE with said center line EASTERLY to the WB line of the Caldwell SW tract; THENCE with said center line SCUTH to the/corner of the Caldwell tract; THENCE with said center line EASTERLY with the SB line of the Caldwell tract to the termination point above mentioned.

It is further ORDERED, notwithstanding no statements of damages were filed with said Jury of View, that there be allowed and paid as just damages, and as adequate compensation for the land taken for said road the amounts of money as follows:

To Mr. and Mrs. B. F. Hunnioutt - - - \$ 15.00;

To Mr. and Mrs. Frank Hunnicutt - - - \$ 5.00;

it appearing that the said Mr. and Mrs. Frank Hunnicutt are mere tanants on land taken, the fee owners of which, Beesie Lee and husband F.Lee, having executed an easement to Titus County for the said road; and that said sums be paid to said parties respectively, or be deposited to their credit with the County Treasurer of this city as provided by law and with notice to such owners of such payments or deposite, whereupon, since no objection is made to such report and auch road is deemed of sufficient importance and is here now found to be and is necessary to the public and the public interest, such road shall be onesed.

It is further CRDERED that said new road be, and it is hereby, classified as a road of the second-class; that since such road lies within eaid Precinct No. 2, same shall constitute and be a part of said Precinct, and shall be worked and maintained in the manner provided by law.

IN THE MATTER OF REPORTING THE SALE OF TITUS COUNTY LANDS, SOLD AT A PREVIOUS DATE:

THE STATE OF TEXAS :

TO THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF TITUS COUNTY, TEXAS:

I, C. T. Neugant, Special Commissioner, appointed by the Commissioners' Court of Titus County, Texas, to make the cale of certain lands belonging to Titus County, Texas, hereby make the following report:

In accordance with the order of this court made on the 14th day of October, 1940, I caused, on the 19th day of October, 1940, a notice of the cale of said lands to be posted at the court house door of Titue County, Texas, a copy of which notice is herewith attached and marked "Exhibit 1", and in accordance with said order, did sell at public auction at the courthouse door of Titue County, Texas, on the 30th day of October, 1940, between the houre of 10:00 o'clock A.M. and 4:00 o'clock P. M. Tract No. 1, as shown by the Exhibit, to Hays Johnson of Titus County, Texas, for the eum of \$25.00, he being the highest bidder therefor; and Tract No. 2, as shown by the Exhibit, to Verne Adems of Titus County, Texas, for the eum of \$20.00, he being the highest bidder therefor; and on said day the said Hays Johnson and Verne Adems having paid the amount bid. WHEREAS, at a regular meeting of the Commissioners' Court of Titus County, Texas, on October, 1940, there was a quorum of said court present and came on to be considered the matter of the sale by Titus County of three small tracts of land located in Titus County and belonging to Titus County. The tracts of land being described as follows:

TRACT NO. 2: BEING a part of the J. B. Hill Survey and beginning at a stake in Verne Adams' S. B. line 308 ft. West of his S. E. corner of 190 acre tract of land - THENCE WEST 70 yds. to a P. O. - THENCE NORTH 140 yds. to a stake - THENCE EAST 70 yds. to a stake - THENCE SOUTH 140 yds. to the beginning and containing two acres of land end being the same land described in a deed from Verne Adams and wife to Titus County, dated July 22, 1919, and recorded in Vol. 46 Page 120 of the Deed Records of Titus County, Texas.

"It is further ordered that C. T. Neugent, County "udge of Titus County, Texas, be and he is hereby appointed special commissioner for the purpose of making the above sale for and on behalf of said county, and he is hereby ordered to give notice of said sale by posting a written notice thereof at the courthouse door in Titus County for ten days preceding the day of sale; advertising that each of said tracts of land will be separately sold at public suction for cash at the courthouse door in said county on the 30th day of October, 1940, between the hours of 10:00 A. M. and 4:00 P. M.; and that said commissioner is hereby given the right and authority to reject any and all bids for said tracts of land, if in his judgment the highest bid for each of said tracts is not reasonable and fair.

"It is further ordered that efter making said sale the special commissioner, C. T. Neugent, will make the deed in conformity with this order for and on behalf of said county, shall duly soknowledge the same, conveying to the purchaser of each of said tracts all the right, title, interest and estate which the county had in end to the above described tracts of land."

NOW, THEREFORE, KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That in accordance with said motion I, C. T. Neugent, special commissioner, do hereby give notice that I will, on the 30th day of October, 1940, at the courthouse door of Titus County, Texas, between the hours of 10:00 A. M. and 4:00 P. M., sell at public auction to the highest bidder for each each of said tracts of land, and in accordance with the order of the comissioners' court will reject any and all bids that are, in my judgment, not reasonable and fair, and in the event the bids for said tracts of land are, in my judgment, fair and reasonable, will execute to the purchaser thereof a dead.
