THE MATTER ON MUNIMENTS OF TITLE TO DIVERS AND SUNDRY OWNERS AND PURCHASERS OF LAND IN MONTAGUE COUNTY, TEXAS, PATENTED ON JUNE 23, 1885 BY THE STATE OF TEXAS TO TITUS COUNTY FOR SCHOOL PURPOSES.

On this the 14th. day of December, A. D. 1948, came on to be hear in its regular order, the matter or muniments of title to divere and sundry owners and purchasers of land in Montague County, Texas, patented on June 25, 1885, by the State of Texas to Titus County for school purposes, by Fatent No. 278, Yolume 13, and the Commissioners' Court being duly assembled at its regular term, with the following members present and participating;

who, affer considering the matter, find that heretofore, to-wit; by order of this court dated Juns 26, 1876, one W. P. Molean was appointed agent of Titus County to locate, survey, and map the School Lands of said Titus County in Montague County, Texas; and by later order dated July 1, 1876, the bond of the said W. P. Molean to sail said lands was approved by this court; and by order dated February 15, 1889, and on August 8, 1898, one E. Y. Brown was appointed agent of Titus County to sail said lands and execute deeds of conveyances and to receive the money for payment thereof and to execute released on payment of notes, or assignments of notes and judgments, held against said lands; and

WHEREAS, Titus County, acting by and through W. P. Mo-ear, -its Agent and Attorney in Fact, sold and conveyed to Joseph Bowman of Montague County, Texas, all of Block No. 52, by deed dated February 20, 1882, recorded in Volume M, page 415, of the Deed Records of Montague County, Texas. The deed recites a consideration of \$24 cash and nine notes for \$24 cach, due 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9 years after date, with 10% interest, payable annually, reference being made to said deed and its terms for conditions, as well as a description of the property, and that said Titus County, by W. P. Molean Agent and Attorney in Faut, sold and conveyed to W. L. Booker all of Block No. 58 of the County County School land, ascording to the subdivision thereof, which deed is dated September 18, 1882, recorded in Book 46, page 428, of the Deed Records of Montague County, Texas, and which deed was for a consideration of \$360. of which \$36 was paid in cash and the balance in nine equal notes of \$36 each, dur and payable 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8, and 9 years after date, each respectively, with 10% interest from date, reference being made to said deed for its consideration and a full description of maid property; and

MHEREAS, a certain judgment in favor of Titus County, in vause No. 2165 in the wistrict Court of Montague County, Texas, was rendered against J. F. Williams on January 10, 1899, recorded in Yook H. at page 149, of the Minutes of the District Court of Montague County, Texas, which judgment was duly assigned by E. Y. Brown, as Agent for Titus County, to T. C. Phillips; and

WHEREAS, the lands so sold by W. P. McLean and E. Y. Brown, and the assignment of said judgment so made by L. Y. Brown, were validly made and with full and complete authority from the Commissioners' Court of Titus County, and the purchasers of said lands have long since fully paid to Titus County the purchase price therefor, including all principal and .interest, and that all of the money so derived from the sale of said lands and judgment aforesaid have been by said parties delivered to the proper costodian therefor in and for Titus County.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED by this Court that the deeds and conveyences as well as the transfer of the judgment to Blooks Nos. 58 and 62, known as portions of the Titus County School Lands in Montague County, Texas, heretofore made and executed by the said W. F. MoLean and E. T. Brown, oe, and are, hereby ratified and confirmed as the acts of the commissioners' Court acting in end for Titus County, Texas, and the Commissioners' Court is authorised to execute any conveyances of deeds of confirmation to the purchasers and to the present owners, necessary or peoper to fully vest and confirm title therein and thereto.

There being no further business, upon motion by Commissioner Nugent seconded by Commissioner Garrett, the court edjourned.
