said Commissioners' Court hereby obligates said County to pay unto the said The First National mank in Mt. Pleasant, Texas, its successors and assigns, the amount of ite aforesaid corip warrants obligations which said Bank has paid or may beweafter pay unto the holders thereof, together with interest upon each of said warrants from the date of the paying of same by said Bank to the holders thereof at the rate of 5% per annum.

That said petitioners are satisfied to have said election called and held as is provided by Article 2806 R.C.S. of Texas, 1925, as smended, and that all prerequisites of said article with reference to the calling of said election have been met and fulfilled:
