COUNTY OF TITUS | KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That, WHEREAS, the Commissioners' Court of Titus County, Texas, has determined that it would be wise and to the best interest of said County for it to employ experts skilled in the matter of appraising and valuing oil and gas properties in said County, said experts to compile and furnish data and information to said Court sitting as a Board of Equalization for the purpose of equalizing valuations of such properties as compared with other property valuations in said County for tex purposes for the years 1945 and 1946, and said date and information to be made evailable in respect to all of such properties properly and lawfully coming before it for consideration in the equalization of values upon renditions made by the owners thereof, or upon renditions made by the tax essessor where the owner or owners may fail to render the same; and,

WHEREAS, seid Court finds that Pritcherd and Abbott, a pertnership of Fort Worth,

Texas, are skilled in such metters and have scientific and technical knowledge in respect
to the appreciaing and valuing of such properties and many years experience in the matter of
appreciaing and valuing such properties; and,

MERRIAS, Pritchard and Abbott, have proposed to asid Commissioners' Gourt offitus Gounty that they will gather and compile information relating to the value of oil and gas properties as of January 1, 1945, and January 1, 1946, and make said information completely available to mid Court, to be used by it as it may see fit in determining what value should be assigned to said properties properly coming before it for consideration; and will charge for their services a sum equal to Four (4) cants on each One Hundred Dollars valuation as finally ascertained and determined for Titus County of oil and gas properties, or other mineral interests.

IT IS THEREFORE AGREED by and between Titus County, Texas, acting herein by and through its Commissioners' Court, Party of the First Pert, and Phitchard and Abbott, of Terrant County, Texas, Perties of the Second Part as follows:

Parties of the Second Part agree to compile a complete list of the record owners of all oil and gas producing properties wherever situated and located in Titus County, Texas, and all undeveloped leases and royalty interests adjacent thereto, as of January 1, 1945, and January 1, 1946, said compilation and record to show the particular interest or interests therein owned, slee to make a survey of all pipe lines, refineries, tank farms, tankaga, transportation facilities, etc.

Parties of the second Part slee agree to securd and make available for the use of Party of the First Part information showing the values of said properties to be considered by Party of the First Part as it may deem fit is determining the proper values for tax assessment purposes for 1945, and 1946, to be assigned to such of said properties as may some before the Party of the First Part sitting as a Board of Equalization for consideration upon renditions made by the owners thereof, or upon renditions made by the tax assessor where the owner, or owners, fail or refuse to render the same.

FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION of the skilled services, technical knowledge and experience of Perties of the Second Port in the performance of the obligations develving upon them hereunder, and in consideration of the information given and assistance furnished by them to Perty of the First Pert in undertaking to value and equalize the values of the said properties properly coming before it for consideration at its equalization hearings in the years 1945, and 1946, Party of the First Pert agrees and obligates itself to companies Parties of the Second First es follows:

FOR THE SERVICES HEREIN AGREED to be performed, Second Perty shall receive the said sum equal to Four (4) cents on each one Rundred dollars valuation on all oil properties, and mineral interests, ascertained and determined by the Commissioners' Court for tax purposes for Titus County, for the years 1945 and 1946, to be paid out of the General Fund of Titus County.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and understood by both Parties that Titus County, Texas, will issue, or cause to be issued to Pritchard and Abbott warrants drawn against the ceneral Fund of said Titus County, Texas, andpayable out of the current revenues for each respective year, 1945, and 1946.

PARTY OF THE FIRST PART hereby specially contracts and obligates itself to, at any time
same may become necessary, page and enter of record such orders as may be proper and necessary
to legalize and facilitate the payment of all sums due Party of the Second Part.

SAID PRITCHARD AND ABBOTT, further agree that in no way will the eaid Titua County be obligated to said Pritchard and Abbott, or their semistants, for seleries, expense, or material, except as above stated.

IN THE MATTER OF KEEPING OFFICERS ON A FEE BASIS FOR THE YEAR 1945

On this the 9th, day of January 1945, came on to be considered the matter of compensating county officials and to determine whether they shall be compensated on the basis of annual salaries or compensated on the basis of fees earned by them in the performance of their official duties. It appearing to the Court that the population of Titus County, according to the last Federal Cansus, is less than twenty thousand inhabitants, and that it is to the best interests of the County to remain on the fee basis for the year 1945, motion was made by Commissioner Goodwin and asconded by Commissioner Fleming that county officers (excluding county surveyors, registers of vital statistics and notaries public) be compensated on the basis of fees sarned for the year 1945. The County Judge put the motion before the court and all Commissioners voted "Aye" Motion was declared carried.
