WHEREAS, all of the above mentioned scrip warrants were and are valid obligations upon the Road & Bridge Fund of said County; and there may not be sufficient funds on hand in said Road & Bridge Fund to pay said Warrant presented, and The First National Bank in Mt. Pleasant, Texas, being the depository for said county, will in due course have such scrip warrants presented to it for payment; and

WHEREAS, it is contemplated that said county will receive about the month of April, 1945 prior thereto and thereafter certain funds and monies as its part or portion due for automobile licenses and registrations in said county for said year, and it will become apart of the Road & Bridge Fund of said County.

NOW, THEREFORE be and it is hereby ordered by the Commissioners' Court of Titus County, Texas that there be and is hereby pledged unto the First National Bank in Mt. Pleasant, Texas, its successors and assigns, all of the first funds that may be hereafter collected from and of current revenues for the year 1944, not heretofore pledged and not legally due for sinking fund requirements therefrom, and/or the first monies and revenues due and owing and that may be paid and collected as the County's part or portion of the automobile licenses and/or registrations for and on automobiles or other vehicles paid in said county for the year 1945 from and with which to repay said Bank for the amounts of the above mentioned scrip warrants with interest as herein provided, which said Bank has paid, or may hereafter pay to the holders thereof and the Commissioners' Court hereby obligates said county to pay unto the said The First National Bank in Mt. Pleasant, Texas, its successors and assigns, the amount of its aforesaid scrip warrants obligations which said bank has paid or may hereafter pay unto the said holders thereof, together with

interest upon each of said warrants from the date of the payment of same by said Bank to the holders thereof at the rate of 5% per annum.

IN THE MATTER OF APPROVING DEPOSITORY BOND FOR COUNTY SCHOOL FUNDS:

THE STATE OF TEXAS: KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, THAT WE, Ed Dickson, County Judge of Titus County, Texas, as Principal, and A. G. Daniel, and W. M. Driggers, and E. M. Keeling and Estella Irvin and D. C. Rowell, as sureties, are held and firmly bound unto Ed Dickson, County Judge of Titus County, Texas, and his successors in office in the sum of Twenty five thousand \$0/100 DOLLARS, for the payment of which we hereby bind ourselves and our heirs, executors and administrators, jointly and severally by these presents.

THE CONDITIONS of this obligation are such that the The First National Bank of Mt. Pleasant Texas, (No officer, director or stockholder of which is a member of the County school board or the Commissioners' Court), was on the 13th. day of February, A.D. 1945, duly and legally chosen by the Commissioners' Court of Titus County, Texas, as county depository of the school funds of said county for a period of two years beginning the 13th. day of February A. D. 1945, and ending sixty days from the time fixed by law for the next selection of a depository.

NOW, THEREFORE, the The First National Bank of Mt. Pleasant, Texas, agrees to the following, to-wit:

That it will safely keep and faithfully disburse the school funds, and perform all the duties and obligations devolving upon it by law as the depository of the school funds of Titus County, and upon presentation pay such warrants and/or vouchers that may be legally drawn on said funds;

That it will account for and report annually a statement of such funds to the Commissioners' Court and to the State Superintendent of Public Instruction, as is required by law;

That it will pay interest daily balances on the school funds, provided such may be authorized under rules, regulations or by-laws promulgated by the Federal Reserve Board; these payments to begin on or after the effective date of the promulgation of such rules;

THE CONDITIONS of this obligation are such that if the said bank shall perform all duties hereinabove specified it shall be null and void; otherwise it shall remain in full force and effect.

The above provisions are given in addition to any remedy the district may have in any suit brought on this obligation in any court in this State. Any suit arising out of or in any way connected with the obligation shall be tried in the County of Titus, State of Texas, in any court therein having jurisdiction of the subject matter thereof.
