TO THE HONORABLE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF TITUS COUNTY, TEXAS:

We, the undersigned duly quelified resident property tax paying voters offitus County, Texas, respectfully pray your honorable Court to order an election to be held in and throughout said Titus County, Texas, to determine:

Whather or not the bonde of said Titus County, Texas, shall be issued in the amount of \$125,000, bearing interest at the rate of not exceeding 3% per annum and maturing at such time or times as may be deemed most expedient by the commissioners Court of said County, not later than 18 years from their date, for thepurpose of the construction, maintenance and operation of macadamized, graveled or peved roads and turnpikes or in sid thereof in said Titus County, Taxas;

And whather or not ad valorem taxes shall be levied on all texable property in said County subject to texation for the purpose of paying the interast on said bonds and to provide a sinking fund for the redemption thereof at maturity.

IN THE MATTER OF ORDER FOR ROAD BOND ELECTION

THE STATE OF TEXAS

COUNTY OF TITUS

On this 26th, day of April, 1945, the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, convened in regular session at a called term of said Court at the regular meeting place in the Courthouse at mt. Pleasant with all members thereof present, vix:

There came on to be considered the petition of Ad S. Rogers and more than fifty other duly qualified resident property tax paying voters of Titus County praying for an election upon the question of authorizing the issuance of road bonds and levying ad valorem taxes in payment thereof, which petition is as follows, to-wit:

PETITION FOR ROAD BOND ELECTION

THE STATE OF TEXAS I COUNTY OF TITUS I

TO THE HONORABLE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF TITUS COUNTY, TEXAS.

WE, the undersigned duly qualified resident property taxpaying voters of Titus County, Texas, respectfully pray your Honorable Court to order an election to be held in and throughout said Titus County, Texas, to determine:

Whether or not the bonds of said Titus County, Texas, shall be issued in the smount of \$125,000.00, bearing interest at the rate of not exceeding 3% per annum and maturing at such time or times as may be deemed most expedient by the Commissioners Court of said County, not later than 18 years from their date, for the purpose of the construction, maintenance and operation of mecademized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes or in aid thereof in said Titus County, Texas!

And whether or not so valorem taxes shall be lavied on all taxable property in said County subject to taxation for the purpose of paying the interest on said bonds and to provide a sinking fund for the redemption thereof at maturity.

Respectfully submitted this 26th. day of April, 1945.

IT APPEARS AFFIRMATIVELY to the Court that said petition is eigned by more than fifty duly cuslified resident property tax paying voters of Titus County who own taxable property in said wounty and who have duly rendered the same for taxation, and that the amount of bonds therein proposed together with all other indebtedness, of Titus County incursed and outstanding under Section 52 of Article 3 of the Constitution of Texas and stetutes enacted pursuant thereto will not exceed one-fourth of the assessed valuation of real property in said County, and that said petition is in all respecte in conformity with law.

TT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUICED AND DECREED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF TITUS COUNTY,
TEXAS, that an election be held in and throughout Titus County, Texas, on the 2nd. day of
June 1945, which is not less then 30 days from the date of this Order, to determine:

WHETHER or not the bonds of said Titus County, Texas, shall be issued in the emount of \$125,000.00 bearing interest at the rate of not exceeding 3% per ennum and maturing at such time or times as may be deemed most expedient by the Commissioners Court of said County, not later than eighteen years from their date, for the purpose of the construction, maintenance and operation of macademized, graveled, or paved roads and turnpikes or in aid thereof in said Titus County, Texas;

And whether or not ad velorem texes shall be levied: on all taxable property in said County subject to texation for the purpose of paying the interest on said bonds and to provide a sinking fund for the redemption thereof at maturity.

Such election shall be held under the provisions of Chepter 16, General Laws enacted by the Thirty-Minth Legislature at its First Celled Session, in 1926, and emendments thereto.

Only legally qualified electors who own senable property in Titue county end who have duly rendered the same for texation shall be qualified to vote at said election, and all voters desiring to support the propostion to issue such bonds and lavy advalorem taxes in payment thereof shall have written or printed on their believe the words.

"FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS AND THE LEVYING OF AD VALOREM TAXES IN PAYMENT THEREOF".

and those opposed thereto shall have written or printed on their ballots the words,

"AGAINST THEISSUANCE OF BONDS AND THE LEVYING OF AD VALOREM TAXES IN PAYMENT TI EREOF".

In the event such bonds shall be authorized and issued, then ad valorem texas are to be levied annually on all taxable property within said County sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity.

Such election shall be held in each of the glaction Precincte of Titus County as hereinafter more fully est out and each voter shall vote in the glaction Precinct of his or her residence.

Such election shall beheld in all the election precincts of Titus County, as hereinafter more fully set out, and the following-named persons are hereby appointed presiding officers of said election at the respective voting places as follows, to-wit:

At the courthouse Building in Mt. Pleasent; in election *redinct No. 1, with Elmer Lee as *residing Officer;

At the Schoolhouse Building in Treen Hill; in Election Precinct No. 2, with R. R. Gilpin as Fresiding officer;

At the Schoolhouse Building in Mershell Springs; in Election Frecinct No. 3, with G. W. Mebane as Fresiding Officer;

At the Schoolhouse Building in Monticello; in slection receinet No. 4, with L. F. Stungt as residing Officer;

At the Schoolhouse Building in Wilkerson; in Election Precinct No. 5, with Clarence Harris as Fresiding Officer;

At the Schoolhouse Building in Cockville; in Election Precinct No. 6, with W. B. Gerner as Fraciding Officer;

At the Schoolhouse Building in Hickory Bill; in Election Precinct No. 7, with E.U. Sime as Presiding Officer;

At the Courthouse Building in Mt. Plansent; in Election *recinct No. 8, with T. U. Welker as Presiding Officer;

At the City mall Building in Talco; in Election Precinct No. 9, with A. V. McElroy as Fraciding Officer;

At the Schoolhouse Building in argo; in Election Frecinct No. 10, with A. A. Cameron as Fresiding Officer:

At the Schoolhouse Building in Winfield; in election Precinct No. 11, with Foe Tample as Freeiding Officer;

At the Schoolhouse Building in Lone Star; in glection Presinct No. 12; with Stewart Dele es Presiding Officer;

At the Courthouse Building in Mt. Pleasant; in Election Precinct No. 13, with J. A. Davie on Preciding Officer;

At the Courthouse suilding in mt. Flement; in Election Free inct No. 14, with w. m. Henderson as Free iding Officer;

At the American Assion Hall building in Mt. Fleament; in Election Frecinct No. 15, with Marvin Brown as Freeiding Officer.

The Presiding Officers shell appoint each additional Judges and Ulerks as they may need to essist them in holding each election.

The manner of holding such election and making and canvassing the returns thereof shall be governed by the General Laws of the State of Texas when not in conflict with the herein-before mentioned statute.

A substantial copy of this order, or notice containing the substance thereof, shall constitute proper notice of such election, and notice thereof shall be given by publication of such notice in a newspaper of general circulation published in said County for three full weeks, the first publication to be at least three full weeks before the date of said election, and in addition thereto for three full weeks prior to said election such notices shall be posted at four public places in Titus County, one of which shall be at the Courthouse door of said County.

The County Clerk of this County is hereby directed to post such notices and to cause the same to be published as herein provided, and further orders are received until such election shell have been held and returns thereof made to this Court.

The foregoingorder was read and it was moved by Commissioner Goodwin and asconded by Commissioner Banks that it bepassed and upon the question's being called it was unanimously passed, Commissioners Banks, Fleming, Wilson, and Goodwin voting AYE and the County Judge concurring; and no one voting NO.
