BE IT REMEMBERED that on the 21st. day of August A.D. 1945, the Commissioners' Court of Titus County, Texas, met in celled session at 10:00 o'clock A. M. at the courthouse in Mt. Fleenant with all members present, to-wit:

when came on to be considered the matter of formulating definite policies with reference to the expenditure of the \$300,000.00 bond money in the repairing and improvement of Titus gounty roads and came on to be offered the following resolution;

- That the Commissioners' Court employ as speedily as possible, in the event said bond issue carries, a competent road engineer who has had experience in the repairing and building of county roads.
- That e central employment office be used to produce from Titus County such employees as are needed, giving in event instance preference of employment to veterene of World War II and which office will occuperate with the local unemployment office.
- That only such employees be hired as may be needed on requirements of the County Engineer.
- 4. That the Commissioners' Court consult with the engineer in the purchaseing of mechinery to the end that adequate mechinery might be purchased and that there be not purchased a surplus of any type of mechinery.
- That all men and all machinery be under the direct supervision and control of the engineer, who shall direct whan, where, and how the seme shall be used.
- That all meterials and supplies for road work be purchased on requirements of the engineer.

WHEREUPON, Commissioner Banks unde a motion that same be adopted, seconded by Commissioner Goodwin and upon a vote being called all woted "AYE" and none voted "NO".
