and passed the following order:

IT APPEARS AFFIRMATIVELY THAT IS is to the best interest of Titus County and to its citizens and taxpayers, and particularly to the public roads of said County, that Titus County should purchase a motor grader for use in the construction and maintenance of the public roads of said County.

AND IT FURTHER APPEARS AFFIRMATIVELY that eaid Gounty has not issued time werrante during the celender year 1946 in excess of \$500.00 per \$1,000,000.00 valuation, and therefore, under the Bond and Warrant Law of 1931, is entitled to issue the warrants herein described in payment for such road machinery without publishing notice and without submission to competitive bide and without the right to referendum, and this Court hereby invokes the authority so to do as provided in said Bond and warrant Law of 1931.

AND IT FURTHER APPEARS that Titue County is this day entering into a contract with John I. Chesley, Tyler, Texas, for the purchase of:

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas:

I.

That the hereinbefore described contract for the purchase of such road machinery be end that same is hereby satisfied and approved.

II.

That for the purpose of paying for such road machinery and the contract therefor, interestbearing time warrants of said County, to be called "TITUS COUNTY ROAD MACHINERY WARRANTS, SERIES 2 of 1946", be issued and made payable to bearer, in the aggregate amount of \$1,350.00 evidencing the debt of Titue County for such road equipment.

Said warrants shall be numbered from 1 to 3 inclusive, and shall be in the denomination of \$500.00 each, except No. 1 for \$350.00, aggregating \$1,350.00.

III.

They shall be dated May 15, 1946, and shall bear interest at the rate of 4% par annual, payable May 15, 1947, and annually thereafter on May 15th each year, which interest is a part of the contract price agreed to be paid for such road machinery.

Principal and interest of such warrants shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America, at the office of the County Treasurer of Titus County, at Mt. Pleasant, Texas.

IV.

They shall be made to mature serially according to the following scheduls:

Such warrants shall be signed by the County Judge, countersigned by the County Clerk, and registered by the County Trescurer, and the seal of the Commissioners Court of said County shall be impressed upon each of them. Proper provision shall be made on the reverse side of each warrant for notation of interest payments.

in lewful money of the United States of America, with interest thereon from the date hereof at the rate of four (45) per cent per annum, interest payable May 15, 1947, and annually thereafter on May 15th each year. There are no coupons attached to this warrant. The Treasurer of said wounty is hereby authorized, ordered and directed to pay to bearer, said principal sum together with interest thereon as they respectively mature.

This warrant is one of a series of three (3) warrants, numbered from one (1) to three (3), inclusive, in the denomination of Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars such, except No. One for \$350.00, issued for the purpose of evidencing the indebtedness of said County for the purchase of road machinery for use in construction and maintenance of public roads, in accordance with contract therefor, under end by virtue of the Constitution and Laws of the State of Texas, and pursuant to an order passed by the Commissioners Court of said County, which order is of record in the Minutes of said Court.

The date of this warrant, in conformity with the order above mentioned is May 15, 1946.

AND IT IS HEREBY CERTIFIED AND RECITED that all acts, conditions and things required to be done precedent to and in the issuance of this warrant, and of the series of which it is a part, have been properly done, have happened and been performed in regular and dus time, form and manner, as provided by law; and that the total indebtedness of said county, including this warrant and the entire series of which it is one, does not exceed any Constitutional statutory limitation; and that provision has been made for the levy and collection of taxes annually for the payment of the principal and interest of this warrant, and of this series of warrants, as the same respectively mature.
