D. 1947, duly and legally chosen by the Commissioners' Court of Titus County, Texas, as County Depository for said county for a period of two years ending sixty days from the time fixed by law for the next selection of a depository, upon its bidding and agreeing to pay the County of \_\_ one per cent interest on "time daposits" on daily balances kept in said depository of said County of Titus at the rate of one per cant per annua, said interest payable monthly.

NOW, THEREFORE, if the above bounden pledgor The First National Bank in Mt. Pleasant.
