IN THE MATTER OF REFUND TO SPECIAL ROAD FUND, PRECINCT ONE:

Motion made by Commissioner Ponder and seconded by Commissioner Moore, that whereas Special Road Fund, Precinct One has paid certain accounts of Special Road Fund Prec. 2 and Special Road Fund Prec. 4, and Road and Bridge Fund and is entitled to a refund; and that the County Treasurer be authorized and directed to transfer into the Special Road Fund Prec. One, the following sum of money from each of the following funds:

IN THE MATTER OF RAISING SALARIES OF HOME DEMONSTRATION AGENT AND COUNTY AGENT:

Motion made by Commissioner Moore and seconded by Commissioner Mankins that the salaries of the County Home Demonstration Agent and County Agent be raised \$300.00 each per year effective April 15, 1948, which raise will make a salary of \$1500.00 per annum for the Home Demonstration Agent and \$1800.00 per annum for the County Agent and said salary shall be payable monthly out of the General County Fund as follows: \$125.00 per month for Home Demonstration Agent and \$150.00 per month for County Agent. Upon being put to a vote said motion carried unanimously.
