All persons who are legally qualified voters of this State and of this County and who are resident property tempayers in said District, who own taxable property in said District and who have duly rendered the same for taxation, shall be entitled to vote at said election, end all voters who favor the aforesaid additional taxation for school purposes shall have written or printed on their ballots, the words:

"FOR INCREASE OF SCHOOL TAX."

And those opposed to such additional taxation shall have written or printed on their ballots, the words:

"AGAINST INCREASE OF SCHOOL TAX."

The Sheriff of this County shall give notice of said election by posting three notices of said election in three public places in said District for not less than ten days prior to the date of said election.
