had by said Board of Trustees was the following:

There came to be considered the question of whether or not to allow the Cookville Independent School District to revert to the status of a common school district, and

It appearing that the Cookville Independent School District has less than one hundred and fifty (150) scholastics according to the latest scholastic census, and

It appearing that it is not the will of the majority of the Board of Trustees of the Cookville Independent School District for said District to revert to a common school district, and

It appearing that it is necessary for the Board of Trustees of said Cookville Independent School District pass a resolution declaring their will that said district retain its status as an Independent School District, and

It further appearing that necessary copies of such minutes be filed in the office of the County Clerk of Titus County, Texas and in the Offices of the Texas Education Agency not later than September 1st:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE COOKVILLE INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT:

That it is not their desire to be governed in the general administration of their school by the laws which apply to common school districts and the keeping of their funds in the county depository, but rather it is their desire that said district shall be governed by laws which apply to other independent school districts.

The above and foregoing resolution being read, it was moved and seconded that same do pass. Thereupon the question being called for, the following members of the Board Voted "AYE" Waylon Andrews, A. W. Huffman, A. M. Taylor, John Allen- - - -and none voted No:

IN THE MATTER OF ORDER PURCHASING BONDS FOR PERMANENT SCHOOL FUND ACCOUNT

On this the 14th. day of July, 1952, the Commissioners' Court of Titus County, Texas convened and among other things there came on for consideration the matter of investing cash funds now held in the Permanent School Fund of the County. After careful consideration it was moved and seconded that such cash funds be invested and the following bonds be purchased from C. E. Burt & Company, Kirby Building, Dallas, Texas;

\$5,000 City of Cross Plains, Texas Refunding Bonds dated March 1, 1952, bearing 3-1/2% interest per annum and maturing March 1, 1963; callable at par March 1, 1964; at a price to yield 3.20% plus accrued interest.

It is, therefore, ordered that said bonds be purchased as set out above and the County Treasurer is hereby directed to make payment for said bonds upon delivery thereof. Upon the question being called the motion carried by unanimous vote.

We, the undersigned officers, holding an election at Argo School Building in Titus County, Texas, in said Argo Common School District No. 804 of Titus County, Texas, on the 10 day of May, 1952, for the purpose of submitting to the resident property taxpaying qualified voters of said School District their action thereupon the proposition of issuing bonds as provided in the order calling said election, DO HEREBY CERTIFY that at said election only resident property taxpaying qualified voters, who owned taxable property in said School District and who had duly rendered the same for taxation, were permitted to vote, and that there were 38 votes cast, of which number there were cast:
