There came on to be considered the returns of an elaction held on the 7th day of March, 1953, in Stonewall Common School District No. 3, on the proposition of issuing bonds as provided in the order calling said election and it appearing that said election was in all respects legally hald and that said returns were duly and legally made and that there were cast at said election 19 valid and legal votes, of which number there were cast:

IT IS THEREFORE FOUND AND DECLARED AND SO CRDERED, by the Commissioners' Court of Titus County, Texas, that a majority of the legally qualified property taxpaying voters who owned taxable property in said School District and who had duly rendered the same for taxation, voting at said election, voted for the issuance of eaid bonds and the levying of the tax in payment thereof, and that therefore, this Court is authorized to issue said bonds and to levy and have assessed and collected said tax in payment thereof.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Roper and upon being put before the Court by the County Judge, was unanimously adopted and declared carried.
