

REGULAR SESSION - AUGUST 12, 1957

BE IT REMEMBERED THAT THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF TITUS COUNTY, TEXAS met in Regular Session at the Courthouse at Mt. Pleasant with the following members present to-wit:

and the following proceedings were had to-wit:

IN THE MATTER OF APPROVING COUNTY TREASURERS MONTHLY REPORT:

Motion was made by Commissioner Roper and seconded by Commissioner Ponder to approve County Treasurers monthly report. Motion carried.

IN THE MATTER OF APPROVING OFFICERS MONTHLY EXPENSES:

Motion was made by Commissioner Hankins and seconded by Commissioner Banks to approve officers monthly expenses. Motion carried.

IN THE MATTER OF APPROVING TO DIVIDE TITUS COUNTY VOTING BOXES:

Motion was made by Commissioner Roper and seconded by Commissioner Ponder to divide Titus County voting boxes #1, 8, 9, 13, 14 and 15 for voting purposes in special, general and primary elections, division to be effective 1 January 1957. Motion carried.

IN THE MATTER OF TRANSFERING FUNDS:

Motion was made by Commissioner Banks and seconded by Commissioner Hankins to transfer \$1500.00 from Permanent Improvement Fund into Precinct #3, Special Road Fund as loan. Motion carried.

IN THE MATTER OF A COURT ORDER BE SENT TO THE BOARD OF COUNTY AND DISTRICT ROAD INDEBT:

Motion was made by Commissioner Ponder and seconded by Commissioner Roper that a court order be sent to the Board of County and District Road Indebtedness requesting the return of \$19,955.49 to Titus County from surplus lateral road funds. This money will be used by the county to maintain, construct, and repair lateral county roads, and shall be place in the lateral road fund of Titus County. Motion carried.

WHEREAS the Official Court Reporter of the 76th Judicial District of Texas, J. B. Redfearn of Mt. Pleasant, Texas, is at present drawing a salary of \$6060.00 per year, (or \$505.00 per month) apportioned among the five counties of the District, and

Whereas due to the high prices of food commodities and other increases in the cost of living, the present salary is not in keeping with the advances of living cost. And the Court deems that the salary should be increased \$45.00 per month, or an increase of \$540.00 per year, making a salary of \$6,600.00 per year, or \$550.00 per month commencing September 1st, 1957, and to be apportioned prorata among the five counties on a per month basis as follows:
