 IN THE MATTER OF A SIGNED PETITION:

Motion was made by Commissioner Ponder and seconded by Commissioner Roper that a petition signed by 317 freeholders and qualified voters of Titus County requesting that an election be ordered in Titus County to determine whether or not cattle, horses, mules, jacks, jennets, donkeys, hogs, sheep and goats shall be permitted to run at large in Titus County be approved and accepted by the Commissioners Court of Titus County, said petition being certified by the County Clerk of Titus County as to be correct as to number and qualifications of said signers. Motion carried.

 IN THE MATTER OF AN ELECTION BE CALLED IN TITUS COUNTY, TEXAS:

Motion was made by Commissioner Roper and seconded by Commissioner Ponder that an election be called in Titus County, Texas on Saturday, December 13, 1958, to determine whether or not the following classes on animals to-wit: cattle, horses, mules, jacks, jennets, donkeys, hogs, sheep and goats shall be permitted to run at large in Titus County, Motion carried.

ORDER AND NOTICE OF ELECTION

THE STATE OF TEXAS
COUNTY OF TITUS

WHEREAS on the 13th day of Oct. 1958, there was presented to the Commissioner's Court of Titus County, Texas, the petition of 317 freeholders and qualified voters of said county requesting that an election be ordered in said county to determine whether or not cattle shall be permitted to run at large in said county; and

WHEREAS on the 13th day of Oct. 1958, the Commissioners' Court of said county ordered that said election be held in said county on the 13th day of December, 1958; and

WHEREAS Article 6959 of the Revised Civil Statutes of the State of Texas also requires that the County Judge shall issue an order for said election;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harry Taylor, in my capacity as County Judge of Titus County, Texas, do hereby order that an election be held in said county on the 13th day of Dec. 1958, which date is not less than 30 days from the date of this order, at which election, in accordance with said petition, the following proposition shall be submitted to the freeholders and qualified voters of said county for their action thereupon;

PROPOSITION NO. 1:

"To determine whether or not cattle shall be permitted to run at large in said county."

PROPOSITION NO. 2:

"To determine whether or not the following classes of animals to-wit: horses, mules, jacks, jennets, donkeys, hogs, sheep and goats shall be permitted to run at large in said county."

The ballots of said election shall have written or printed thereon the following:

For the stock law as to cattle
Against the stock law as to cattle

For the stock law as to horses, mules, jacks, jennets, donkeys, hogs, sheep and goats.
Against the stock law as to horses, mules, jacks, jennets, donkeys, hogs, sheep and goats.

Each voter shall mark out with black ink or pencil one of the above expression, thus leaving the other as indicating his vote, or each voter may vote for the expression of his choice by placing an X in the square beside said expression as provided by the Election Code of the State of Texas.

The manner of holding said election shall be governed as near as may be by the Election Code of this State, and none but freeholders and qualified voters of said county shall be allowed to vote at said election.

On or before the tenth day after said election, the officers holding said election shall make returns thereof to the County Judge and return the ballot boxes and supplies pertaining to said election as provided by the Election Code of this State.

A cop of this order shall serve as notice of said election, and said notice shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation published in this county, the date of the first publication being at least 30 days before the date of said election and continue in each successive issue of said newspaper up to the date of the election.
