AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY JUDGE TO GIVE NOTICE OF THE INTENTION OF THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF TITUS COUNTY, TEXAS, TO FASS AN ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF TITUS COUNTY PERMANENT IMPROVEMENT REPUNDING BONDS IN THE MAXIMUM AMOUNT OF \$250,000 FOR THE PURPOSE OF REPUNDING, CANCELING AND IN LIEU OF A LIKE AMOUNT OF OUTSTANDING FERMANENT IMPROVEMENT WARRANTS OF SAID COUNTY.

WHEREAS, Titus County, Texas, has outstanding and unpaid the following described Permanent Improvement Warrants:
