when, among other proceedings had, were the following:

Commissioner Raney introduced an order and moved its passage. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Taylor. The motion, carrying with it the passage of the order, prevailed by the following vote:

AYES: Commissioners Taylor, Parr, Raney, Bynum;

NOES: NONE

The Order is as follows:

WHEREAS, each and all of the members of the Commissioners Court was duly and sufficiently notified, officially and personally, in advance, of the time, place and purpose of this meeting; and

WHEREAS, proper notice of this meeting has been duly and timely posted as provided by law; and

WHEREAS, there came on to be considered the returns of an election held in Titus County on the 18th day of May, 1971, on the following propositions:

PROPOSITION NO. 1

SHALL the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, be authorized to issue bonds of said County in the sum of \$600,000.00, bearing interest at such rate or rates as shall be determined within the discretion of the Commissioners Court, and maturing at such times as may be fixed by the Commissioners Court, serially or otherwise, not to exceed thirty (30) years from their date, for the purpose of the construction, maintenance and operation of macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes, or in aid thereof, in said County, and to levy an ad valorem tax upon all the taxable property in Titus County for the purpose of paying the interest on said bonds and providing a sinking fund for the redemption thereof at maturity, the proceeds of such bonds, to be used for Hwy. #271 and Hwy #49, as authorized by Article 3, Section 52, of the Constitution of Texas, as amended at an election held on November 3, 1970?

PROPOSITION NO. 2

SHALL the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, be authorized to issue bonds of said County in the sum of \$400,000.00, bearing interest at such rate or rates as shall be determined within the discretion of the Commissioners Court, and maturing at such times as may be fixed by the Commissioners Court, serially or otherwise, not to exceed thirty (30) years from their date, for the purpose of the

construction, maintenance and operation of macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes, or in aid thereof, in said County, and to levy an ad valorem tax upon all the taxable property in Titus County for the purpose of paying the interest on said bonds and providing a sinking fund for the redemption thereof at maturity, the proceeds of such bonds to be used for East Loop and Farm to Market Roads, as authorized by Article 3, Section 52, of the Constitution of Texas, as amended at an election held on Nov. 3, 1970

AND WHEREAS, it appearing from the returns, duly and lawfully made, that there were cast at the election where only the resident qualified voters who own taxable property in the County and who have duly rendered the same for taxation, voted, valid and legal votes as follows:

PROPOSITION NO. 1

FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$600,000 BONDS AND THE LEVYING OF THE TAX IN PAYMENT THEREOF-----633 votes.
AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF \$600, 000 BONDS AND THE LEVYING OF THE TAX IN PAYMENT THEREOF-----649 votes.

PROPOSTION NO. 2

FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$400,000 BONDS AND THE LEVYING OF THE TAX IN PAYMENT THEREOF-----606 votes.
AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF \$400,000 BONDS AND THE LEVYING OF THE TAX IN PAYMENT THEREOF-----666 votes.

AND WHEREAS, it appearing from the returns, duly and lawfully made, that there were cast at the other election where all other resident qualified voters of the County voted, valid and legal votes as follows:

PROPOSTION NO. 1

FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$600,000 BONDS AND THE LEVYING OF THE TAX IN PAYMENT THEREOF32 votes.
AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF \$600,000 BONDS AND THE LEVYING OF THE TAX IN PAYMENT THEREOF.....26 votes.

PROPOSTION NO. 2

FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$400,000 BONDS AND THE LEVYING OF THE TAX IN PAYMENT THEREOF32 votes.
AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF \$400,000 BONDS AND THE LEVYING OF THE TAX IN PAYMENT THEREOF26 votes

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED AND DECLARED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF TITUS COUNTY, TEXAS:

That a majority of the legally qualified property taxpaying voters who own taxable property in said County and who had duly rendered the same for taxation, and a majority of the resident qualified voters, voting, voted 685 the issuance of the bonds and the levying of the tax in payment thereof as submitted in Proposition No. 1, and 638 the issuance of the bonds and the levying of the tax in payment thereof as submitted in Proposition No. 2.

PASSED AND APPROVED at a meeting open to the public, this the 19th day of May, 1971, after public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given and posted as required by law.
