RESOLUTION FOR TITUS COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT

WHEREAS, The Texas Highway Department has prepared its 1971-1972 Consolidated Highway Program which includes a project in Titus County requiring right of way, namely:

State Highway 49 - From Near East City Limits of Mt. Pleasant to Morris County Line (10.0 Miles)

WHEREAS, the Texas Legislature through H.B. 620 has provided a means for partial reimbursement of authorized right of way purchases to counties;

WHEREAS, The Texas Highway Commission under Commission Order No. 42113 dated May 31, 1957, outlined a procedure to be eligible for partial reimbursement of authorized right of way purchases, and one provision of said Commission Order requests a Contractual Agreement between the County and the State;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the County Judge of Titus County be authorized to execute for and on behalf of Titus County the Right of Way Contractual Agreements with the State in accordance with and for the purpose of carrying out the terms and provisions of the Texas Highway Department Minute Order No. 42113, and the County Clerk is hereby directed to attest these Contractual Agreements and to affix the Seal of

Titus County thereto; and the County Judge is authorized to execute on behalf of Titus County any supplemental contracts involving fencing or utilities or modifications to the above mentioned right of way contracts for this project.

Gentlemen:

The enclosed copy of order, the original having been filed for record with the District Clerk is self-explanatory.

The re-apportionment (not raise) was brought about because Franklin County is removed from the District effective July 1, 1971. Franklin County (in two judicial districts) was paying \$39.00 a month and under the new schedule Titus & Camp Counties will each pay an additional \$13.00 more per month with Morris & Marion Counties each paying an additional \$6.50 more per month. Marion County is in two judicial districts and in computing its share a one-half figure population must be use.

IN THE 76TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT COURT  
IN THE MATTER OF ADJUSTING THE OFFICIAL  
COURT REPORTER'S SALARY

Whereas, the 62nd Legislature of the State of Texas, has enacted House Bill 704, which was signed by the Governor, and which Bill removed Franklin County from the 76th Judicial District and places it in the 8th Judicial District effective July 1, 1971,

And whereas, beginning July 1, 1971, Franklin County will no longer be obligated or responsible for paying its proportionate part of share of the Court Reporter's salary; and whereas it is necessary that such part be apportioned among the remaining Counties of the district, viz. Titus, Morris, Camp and Marion according to their population as reflected by the last census.

It is accordingly ordered that the 76th Judicial Court Reporter's salary of \$7,800.00 a year or \$650.00 per month be apportioned pro rate among the four (4) Counties, effective July 1, 1971, on a per month basis as follows:

Titus County-----	\$260.00
Morris County-----	195.00
Camp County-----	123.50
Marion County-----	71.50
