ALLEN LAPRADE Absent DAN BYNUM when, among other proceedings had, were the following: Commissioner Parr introduced am order and made a motion that it be passed. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Raney. The motion, carrying with it the passage of the order, prevailed by the following vete: AYES: Commissioners Taylor, Parr, Raney, The County Judge announced that the order had been finally passed. The Order is as follows: ORDER FOR ELECTION WHEREAS, each and all of the members of the Commissioners Court of Titus County, Texas, was duly and sufficiently notified, officially and personally, in advance, of the time, place and purpose of this meeting; an

WHEREAS, proper notice of this meeting has been duly and timely posted as provided by law; and WHEREAS, the 58th Legislature of Texas, Regular Session, 1963, Chapter 298, authorized the creation, establishment, maintenance and operation of a hospital district coextensive with the boundaries of Titus County, Texas by election; and

WHEREAS, a petition signed by more than fifty (50) resident legally qualified property taxpaying voters has been presented to the Commissioners Court praying that an election be ordesed in said County, in accordance with the provisions of the aforementioned Act of the Legislature of Texas to determine whether or not there shall be created a Hospital District coextensive with the boundaries of Titus County, Texas, with the authority to levy a tax not to exceed seventy-five cents (75c) on the \$100 valuation of taxable property therein, for the purpose of (1) paying the interest on and creating a sinking fund for bonds which may have been assumed or which may be issued by the Hospital District for hospital purposes as herein provided; (2) providing for the operation and maintenance of the hospital or hospital system; and (3) for the purpose of making further improvements and additions to the hospital system, and for the acquisition of necessary sites therefor, by purchase, lease or condemnation;

WHEREAS, the Act authorising the creation, establishment, maintenance and operation of the hospital district coextensive with Titus County, provided that the election to determine the creation of said District with the said authority to tax, and other stated purposes and matters, provides that the election for said purposes shall be held not less than thirty (30) days from the time said election is ordered; and

WHEREAS, acting on said petiton and also independently on its own motion, as provided by law, the Commissioners Court finds and determines that it is for the best interest of said County and its inhabitants to have such election for such purposes as hereinabove stated.

IT IS THEREFORE CONSIDERED AND "ORDERED BY THE COURT that an election be held throughout said County on the 16th day of January, 1973, which is not less than thirty (30) days from the date of this Order, at which election the following proposition shell be submitted:

## PROPOSITION

SHALL there be created a Hospital District coextensive with the boundaries of Titus County, Texas, with the authority to lavy a tax not to exceed seventy-five cents (75c) on the \$100 valuation of taxable property therein for the purpose of (1) paying the interest on and creating a sinking fund for bonds which may have been assumed or which may be issued by the Hospital District for hospital purposes as herein provided; (2) providing for the operation and maintenance of the hospital or hospital system; and (3) for the purpose of making further improvements and additions to the hospital system, and for the acquisition of necessary sites therefor, by purchase, lesse or condemantion?

That absentee voting shall be conducted at the Office of the County Clerk in the County Courthouse, Mt.

Pleasant, Taxas, for the period absentee voting is permitted by law; the hours designated for absentee voting shall be from 9:00 a. m. to 5:00 p. m., on each day except Saturdays, Sundays and official State helidays.
