ORDER INCORPORATING THE TOWN OF MONTICELLO, TEXAS

WHEREAS, on this the 23rd day of October, 1973 an election was held in the town of Monticello, Titus County, Texas to determine whether or not the town of Monticello, Texas, should be incorporated as a town of more than 200 inhabitants under Chapter 11, Title 28 of the Revised Civil Statutes of 1925 of the State of Texas, and amendments thereto, and whereas the said election returns were filed with me; and

WHEREAS on the 29th day of October, 1973 at a special called meeting of the Commissioners Court, the canvassing of the returns of said election was held with all the Commissioners being present, a count was had of the votes cast at said election with the following results shown: 18 votes were cast for "Corporation" and 0 votes were cast for "No Corporation".

Now, therefore, I, William Wayne Landrum, in my official capacity as County Judge of Titus County, Texas, do hereby declare that the town of Monticello, in Titus County, Texas is incorporated within the boundaries as shown by the attached plat and field notes hereof, said town being more than 200 inhabitants under Chapter 11, Title 28 of the Revised Civil Statutes of 1925 of the State of Texas, and amendments thereto.
