IN THE MATTER OF
PAYING ROAD HANDS

Motion made by Commissioner Parr and seconded by Commissioner Parish to pay Road Hands upon the approval of the County Auditor. Motion Carried.

IN THE MATTER OF
PAYING MONTHLY BILLS

Motion by Judge Landrum and seconded by Commissioner Reese to pay monthly bills upon approval of the County Auditor. Motion Carried.

IN THE MATTER OF
REQUEST FROM SHERIFF DEPARTMENT

Motion by Commissioner Parr and seconded by Judge Landrum to purchase two sirens and one set of red lights for Sheriff's Department. Motion Carried.

IN THE MATTER OF
FENCING STATE HIGHWAY 49

Fencing is complete along State Highway 49 except for parcel 33 belonging to Modella Brooks. Responsibility for fencing was determined in litigation of the District Court. Further, there is a small number of parcels to be fenced after highway construction. Such parcels may be determined by the State Department of Highway Transportation.

IN THE MATTER OF
COUNTY LAW LIBRARY

Be it remembered that at present the County Law Library consists of only Federal Statutes, Reports, and Periodicals. The District Judge 76th Judicial District has offered to make his Law Library (State) available to the Courthouse staff and visiting attorneys. In return he has requested that the upkeep of such library be funded from the Law Library Fund. He further agreed to raise the filing for payable to the Law Library Fund by \$ 1.00 for a total of \$ 6.00 per case filed.

THEREFORE BE IT ORDERED that henceforth the maintenance cost of the District Judge's Library be absorbed by the Law Library Fund.

IN THE MATTER OF
MRS. INA MAE KING

The request of Mrs. King to remain in the employ of Titus County beyond her 70th birthday is approved. A letter expressing our appreciation to Mrs. King for her long service; and encouraging her to remain in County employ has been prepared and transmitted to the Texas County and District Retirement System.

ORDER CORRECTING ORDER CANVASSING RETURNS AND DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE SPECIAL ELECTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF DETERMINING WHETHER OR NOT HARTS BLUFF COMMON SCHOOL DISTRICT SHOULD BE INCORPORATED AS HARTS BLUFF INDEPENDANT SCHOOL DISTRICT, AND FOR THE ELECTION OF SEVEN (7) TRUSTEES THEREFORE.

On December 28, 1978, it having come to the attention of the Court that its order entered on May 3, 1978, incorporating HARTS BLUFF DISTRICT, contains an incorrect description of the boundaries of HARTS BLUFF INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT as therein incorporated, and it appearing to the Court that such order, through mistake, does not correctly designate the true boundary lines;

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED THAT SUCH ORDER BE CORRECTED TO REFLECT THE TRUE BOUNDARY LINES OF HARTS BLUFF INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT, as shown by field notes recorded at Vol. 9, page 161 of the Minutes of the Commissioner's Court of Titus County, Texas, which field notes are shown by copy of said minutes certified to by the County Clerk of Titus County, Texas, and attached hereto.
