WHEREAS, the Official Court Reporter of the 276th Judicial District of Texas, B.R. Tucker, is presently drawing a salary of \$24,366.88 (2,030.57 per month) apportioned among the four counties of the District, and

WHEREAS, due to inflation in the cost of living, and in order to conform his salary to that of Official Court Reporters serving a similar population and with a like work load, the Court deems it necessary and appropriate that the salary should be increased \$203.06 a month or an increase of \$2,436.72 per year, making a salary of \$26,803.60 per year, or \$2233.65 per month, commencing on October 1, 1985, and to be apportioned among the four counties on a per monthly basis as follows:

CAMP COUNTY-----	\$446.73
MORRIS COUNTY-----	\$670.09
TITUS COUNTY-----	\$893.45
MARION COUNTY-----	\$223.36

This order is entered pursuant to and in conformity with the provisions of Article 3912K Section 3 Vernon's Annotated Statutes of the State of Texas, this 23rd day of July, 1985, and shall be effective as of October 1, 1985.

Copies of this order shall be entered in the minutes of the District Court of each County of the District and a copy thereof shall be filed with each Commissioners' Court of the District.
